FROM OUR MINISTER



Dear Friends,

I greet you all in the name of our Lord Saviour Jesus Christ. I am writing to you whilst in South Africa with my family and granddaughter enjoying the sunshine.

I start off with a sad note to inform you that Mrs Jean Edwards passed away peacefully at her home on

Boxing Day. She was a committed and prominent member of Southville Methodist Church and took on responsibilities and roles within the church for many years and I understand that she was an organist. Each time we visited her she would appreciate singing Methodist hymns with her. It is with profound sadness and sorrow to hear of her passing. My condolences and thoughts go to her family especially her son David who was her carer. My prayers are with them and the community at Southville.

When we came to the end of 2020, there was some hope and expectation that we had seen the worst of the global pandemic, however 2021 has not been much different and now the entire world is entering the third year of this unprecedented event. I have no doubt that many of us have been affected by the virus, but it is at times like this that we need to remind ourselves that God is still on the throne (Psalms 48.8).
