#### FROM OUR MINISTER



Dear Friends,

I have been away to that green country of Australia Tasmania for the funeral of my beloved young sister Mrs Elizabeth Dorcas Saunders who passed away end of April 2021. This has been a difficult time for me and my family to grieve when we are all scattered in different parts of the world. The covid 19 pandemic

and travel restrictions created great challenges and to get things right was a struggle. Laws and regulations were changing due to new information on Covid 19.I had to change my ticket twice and quarantine in Melbourne for 14 days under exceedingly difficult conditions, for me it was more than a prison, you do not come out of the room, you eat what they provide, after that you have to pay a large sum of money. I had to create my own daily routine to keep normal and keep hope. I was fortunate that my window faced the airport, and I could sit, watch and count the planes as they landed and take off. My sister who was quarantining in Sydney was frustrated because her window faced a wall, she had no view of life at all. However, the restrictions were extremely hard for Travellers but for Australia it is good. They do not have Covid 19, people do not wear masks, their economy is intact, and they did not lose lives. They manged to protect they population and limited the number of people who enter only those with an important business are allowed to enter the country.

So, my sister Elizabeth had lived the greater part of her life in Hobart. The funeral service took place at Sacred Heart Catholic Church, New Town and internment took place in Hobart, Tasmania according to her wishes on the 20<sup>th</sup> of May 2021. I wish to thank you for your thoughts and prayers. We were overwhelmed by your love and compassion given. The spiritual support was a source of great comfort, at our time of grieving.

I was looking forward to the end of Lockdown so we can start opening our churches for more church activities to take place. However, this has been postponed for another four weeks. Currently, all our churches on the Eastern End have opened their doors for worship, which is a great step in the right direction. The numbers of those attending, are encouraging, some are being cautious. This Sunday was significant for me to led worship for the first time at Woodthorpe Methodist Church. I saw a God who has the best plans for his sacred Church for a future with hope. We have started to look into the future to see how we can impact the communities we serve. And what projects and events are likely to attract people and meet their needs of daily living, as they engage with our Church community.

On the 13<sup>th</sup> of June, 2021 the Assistant Chair of the Southeast District Reverend Sam Funnel came to lead worship at Woodthorpe Methodist Church. We were highly honoured and encourage by her finding time to come and share and fellowship with us. At Southville Methodist Church worship is now taking place on weekly basis, again not everyone is attending but the door is opened. The Church is opened the first Saturday of the month for Private prayers from 09:30-10:30 am. Ashford Common Methodist Church is opening for morning worship and evening worship. The way we are going with Lockdown restrictions extended we do not know where we are going. COVID 19 virus is extraordinarily complex because it changes from one variant to another. We hope that the vaccines will be able to conquer the virus so we can have a great summer, with people travelling to meet family, relatives and friends. Blessings, Juliet

## From the Circuit Office – and Beyond

**Dear Friends** 

I am writing this just after we have heard the news that Covid-19 pandemic restrictions are to continue until at least the 19<sup>th</sup> July 2021. I know that a lot of people will find this rather frustrating and it certainly makes managing the Circuit rather a challenge. However, the good news is that Churches will continue to operate and support their fellowships with Services both in person and on-line as well as with groups meetings taking place in compliance with the guidance and advice that has been issued.

By the time you read this the June Circuit Meeting will have taken place. Circuit Meetings are an important part of the management of groups of local Churches within the Methodist Church. Our meeting covers all the Churches in the Staines and Feltham Circuit and the main focus is to share in a conversation about the work of God and the development of local policy. At our meeting we will have looked at a number of building work applications, a set of new local policy documents, and the new rules relating to weddings, (but not same sex weddings as this is being considered by Conference at the end of June). We will also have considered the preparation of a Circuit Profile as part of the work to be done relating to the Stationing process. In addition, I recently circulated a booklet, "Take you next steps in Evangelism and Growth" to all churches and we will have had the opportunity to comment on this and how it fits with our local requirements.

The Circuit Meeting is also responsible for ensuring that policies and procedures are in place. All local Churches are required to update their data protection records on an annual basis and I need confirmation from all churches by the middle of August that this has been done.

I also want to record my thanks to Verna Doe who has carried out the important task of Circuit Safeguarding Officer for many years. I have valued her support as she has provided a point of contact for all of the Churches in regard to safeguarding matters. Verna has now stepped down and the Circuit is now looking for someone to take on the role. If you believe that this is something that might interest you, do please get in touch with me so that I can give you the necessary details.

A number of tasks that I mentioned in my previous letter remain unresolved including the sale of Wendover Road and the sale/purchase of the Manse in Feltham. Negotiations continue with interested parties and I will keep you informed of progress.

I am looking forward to meeting with many of you over the summer as I visit the Churches in the Eastern End.

## LOCAL PREACHING

A Methodist local preacher is a layperson who has been accredited by the Methodist Church to lead worship and preach on a regular basis. They have played an important role in Methodism since the earliest days of the movement, and have also been important in English social history. These preachers continue to serve an indispensable role in the Methodist Church of Great Britain, in which they lead the majority of church services.

Methodism formally broke with the Anglican church in 1784 because of the activities of John Wesley. Due of the limited number of ordained ministers he could call on, Wesley appointed local preachers who were not ordained but whom he examined, and whom he felt he could trust to lead worship and preach: though not to minister sacraments.

Local preachers would regularly spend a whole day with a local church, leading one or more services and undertaking pastoral visiting. Many travelled significant distances in the course of a day, often on foot.

In its essentials, this pattern has remained in British Methodism to the present day. Although by the end of the nineteenth century most circuits (clusters of churches) were staffed by several ministers, there were almost always more churches in the circuit than ministers, many of them offering two or three services every Sunday. The need for local preachers has never declined and in many circuits an active local preacher may well be involved in preparing and leading worship on seven or eight occasions in a thirteen-week quarter.

Methodism has always acknowledged and valued the ministry of women and from the earliest days women have served as local

preachers (the heroine of George Eliot's Adam Bede is represented as one).

Local preachers have always been required to undergo some form of training. Because Methodism had great strength among the lower middle classes and skilled working classes in 19thcentury England, training as a local preacher was one of the ways in which intelligent people who had little chance of formal schooling acquired education and an ability at public speaking. Consequently, the discipline and eloquence of Methodist local preachers found a ready use in the developing labour movement. Many of the founders of the trade union movement in Britain were local preachers, perhaps most famously four of the Tolpuddle martyrs.

Compared to lay people in some other denominations, Methodist local preachers are accorded significant authority over the progress of a service, for which they are seen as having overall responsibility, rather than just delivering the sermon.

Nonconformist churches have long had similar arrangements, and the Church of England now makes considerable use of "lay readers". However Anglican lay readers, and indeed the lay preachers of other denominations, have never quite enjoyed the status within their own churches, or the recognition beyond them, that are associated with the Methodist local preacher.
