## FROM OUR MINISTER



Dear Friends,

As I put my pen down to write this letter, I cannot believe that, this is the last “*The Eastern End News*” magazine for the year 2021. The year is ending whilst we are still experiencing the difficulties created by COVID 19. Some of us have been so unfortunate. We are losing family members its like it is a continuous process. We are living in sorrow and tears, it seems it’s not getting away. I am in deep sorrow mourning. I have just had another unexpected death in the family of my niece Rugare Mutsvene Ngoro 29 yrs with a promising future and had become a vibrant successful businesswoman. She was snatched by C19 and was buried on the 15<sup>th</sup> October, 2021 at Zororo Farm Wedza, Zimbabwe where I grew up. The family is stunned and we are in great shock.

I believe there are many families going through the same experiences, there are thousands and thousands who have been affected and lost their loved ones and those gaps will never be filled but are printed in our hearts. I am hoping and praying that, the dark cloud of C19 will go with 2021 and that 2022 will lead us with Christ’s Light and bring hope to look forward to live as best as can be expected. Trusting God in all situations good and bad, he is in the midst as He was with Moses and the children of Israel in the wilderness. We keep looking up to Him our ever-present Help for direction and guidance.

However, in spite of everything happening God reigns, He is still on the Throne (Psalm 47.8) and the Gospel of the Good News is being preached. The Churches in the *Eastern End* have now completely opened their doors for worship and community activities have started, though we remain cautious following our Risk Assessment protocols. At Woodthorpe Methodist Church at the Edinburgh drive there are a lot of activities now beginning to

take place. Worship every month with celebration of the Lord's Supper is taking place. On the Sunday of the 3<sup>rd</sup> October 2021 we had a combined Harvest Service with Kingdom Living Church, the Service was well attend and we celebrated the Lord's Supper and shared fellowship and lunch refreshments afterwards. It was a glorious time and people seemed to appreciate meeting physically and sharing their stories. The roof at Edinburgh Drive has been fixed and the foundations for constructing a ramp have been dug-and work is also being arranged to reconstruct the toilet so that it is accessible to all Users. The church has also opened the doors for Thursday Fellowship and people to attend fortnightly. At Clarendon Road there is worship every Sunday except the first Sunday when worship is at Edinburgh Road. Messy church has not started to meet physically. Southville Methodist Church is open for morning worship every Sunday. Monthly individuals visit the Church for private prayers the first Saturday of each month.

Ashford Common Methodist Church celebrated Harvest and the 61<sup>st</sup> year Church Anniversary of the Sunday of the 19<sup>th</sup> October, 2021. The Boy's Brigade and the Nursery school are work in progress. At Christ Church the process of the Partnership is still in work in progress. Regardless of the Limitations created by COVID19 the work of the Kingdom of God is thriving in the Eastern End Churches impacting the lives of the people they serve.

Now we are at the edge of another waiting. We are just five weeks from Advent a period of waiting. Advent is not just a passive time, it is active internal waiting that brings new life. Advent is a gift, that is life transforming. It invites us to be ready to meet the Lord when he comes again to honour him with our lives. Advent invites us to focus on, learn a skill essential for our Christian journey.

I wish you a blessed joyful Christmas as you worship God and celebrate with friends and family here and abroad.

## **From the Circuit Office – and Beyond**

Dear Friends

For a lot of Methodists October provides an opportunity to sit back and take a breath after a whole series of meetings that take place at the beginning of the Connexional Year in September. I am very grateful to everyone who has a place on all the Committees that enable us to keep the Circuit functioning as it should.

This year I am very aware of the additional work that has been done by the Circuit Invitations Committee. As you know we are in the process of inviting a Presbyterian to join us in the Circuit. This appointment will affect all of our Churches but those on the Eastern side will be particularly aware of the proposed changes. We are seeking to appoint a Probationer Minister (for whom this would be a first appointment) and whilst the District and Connexion originally indicated that they supported our request for such an appointment, following an inspection of the Manse at Feltham, it is clear that considerable work on the premises needs to be undertaken before a Probationer would be allocated to us. It is possible that provided this work is carried out early next year we may be able to re-submit our request.

In the meantime, we have been permitted to make an application for the appointment of a Presbyterian to the Circuit. This person would cover the same Churches as the Probationer which are Southville, Ashford Common and Staines. The process of appointing a Presbyterian takes a while to complete and a number of "Stationing Rounds~" will take place between now

and mid-January 2022. Our Invitations Committee would meet with anyone who is selected to visit us. It is possible that the visit may need to take place via “Zoom”. I must point out that there is no guarantee that a person will be identified in any of the three rounds. Those Circuits who are not matched in these initial rounds enter a process whereby the remaining vacancies are considered by the “Stationing Action Group”. Almost certainly it is likely that some Circuits will not receive the Presbyters they have requested and we may be one of those Circuits in which case other plans will need to be put in place to cover all our Churches next year.

Your on-going prayers for our Invitations Committee and the District are very important, so do please continue to remember those involved as you meet with God in prayer over the coming weeks.

I am sure that as you read “The Eastern End News” you will be excited by the work that is going on in our Churches as each location reaches out to our neighbours.

Having been able to draw breath, we are now entering the season of Advent and Christmas. This time of year invariably provides good opportunities to share the good news of the Gospel. Elsewhere in the “Eastern End News:” you will find details of services taking place and I hope that you will be able to support these and invite family and friends to come along as well.

Even though we are still some time away from Christmas, my prayer is that you will have a blessed and peace Christmas and a happy New Year.

**The earth is the LORD's, and everything in it,  
the world, and all who live in it; ( Psalm  
24:1)**

I have been watching some of the TV presentations about those competing for the 'Earthshot' prize this year, leading up to the meeting of the UN Conference on Climate Change ( COP 26) which begins on Monday 8<sup>th</sup> November in Glasgow.



Maybe you have also watched some of the inspiring things being done to reduce, stop and repair the damaging effects our human life is having on our climate and environment. These ideas are already being used in different parts of the globe to restore and renew the life of the earth. There is also much that we are doing and can do individually: our choices of transport, food, recycling, re-use, even our holiday plans. As followers of Christ we are commanded to serve and to love our neighbours as ourselves. Caring for the whole of God's creation is vital. Every part of life on earth; soil, plants, insects, fish, animals, birds, atmosphere and climate all depend on each other.

There are also things we can do to help as communities, churches and nations. Below is the first part of the multi- faith declaration that was made by faith leaders in Britain and Ireland (including the Archbishops of Canterbury and York and the President and Vice President of the Methodist Conference ), ahead of the COP 26 meeting.:

## **Glasgow Multi-Faith Declaration for COP26**

“Our faith communities are united in caring for human life and the natural world. We share a belief in a hopeful future, as well as an obligation to be responsible in caring for our common home, the Earth.

We recognise the opportunities that COP26 brings in addressing the urgent need for action in limiting the effects of climate change and the critical importance of decisions made in this conference to take forward the agreement made in Paris in 2015.

People have exploited the planet, causing climate change. We recognise that the burden of loss and damage falls most heavily on people living in poverty, especially women and children.

We acknowledge the commitments made through the Lambeth Declaration in 2015. Now, because of the gravity of our situation, the impact of climate change around the world, and the inequality of its effects we seek to strengthen those commitments.

**We commit to respond to this challenge by:**

**Reflecting deeply in prayer, meditation and worship to discern how to care for the earth and each other, and to encourage our respective communities to do the same.**

**Making transformational change in our own lives and in the lives of our communities through individual and collective action.**

**Being advocates for justice by calling on governments, businesses and others who exercise power and influence to put into effect the Paris agreement; to make the transition to a just and green economy a priority; and to commit to science-based**



**targets that are aligned with a healthy, resilient, zero-emissions future.....”**

We remind governments of their commitments made in Paris in 2015 to limit global warming to 1.5 degrees, and of Article 17 of the Universal Declaration on Bioethics and Human Rights to protect the environment, the biosphere and biodiversity. We call upon them to take the urgent action needed to avert the loss, damage, and forced migration threatened by climate change.

We look to governments to work together and with others to create a positive vision for 2050 where addressing climate change is not just an opportunity to stop burning fossil fuels, but also: to achieve cleaner air and water; to reduce food wastage; to ensure a just and equitable sharing of the earth’s resources; and to protect the habitats we share with all other life on whose health we also depend.

Across our doctrinal and political differences, we know that we must change our ways to ensure a quality of life which all can share, and we need to provide hope for people of all ages, everywhere, including future generations. To offer hope in the world we need to have confidence that those in power understand the vital role they have to play at the Glasgow COP26.

Our collective energy and prayers will be with those working for a successful outcome.”
