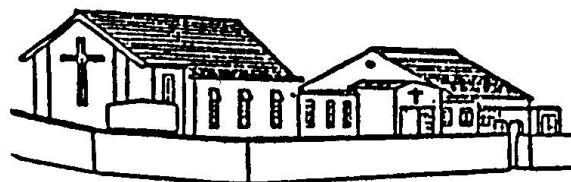

Greetings from all at Christ Church Feltham

Did you know that it has been over 5 years since Christ Church Feltham was reopened for worship as an ecumenical partnership between the Methodist and Anglican churches? What started as an urgent matter of prayer among a faithful few, gave birth to a vision, which led to the journey we've been on to see Christ Church Feltham remain a centre for worship and mission in Central Feltham.

When you hit a significant moment like this, if you are anything like me, you tend to look back with gratitude as you consider all the things God has done and look forward with faith and hope as you ponder all that God could do next!

When looking back, I find myself being so grateful for all that has gone before at Christ Church Feltham. During one of the Covid 19 lockdowns, we had the joy of giving groceries to the most vulnerable in our community and I was struck time and again by the amount of people who said 'oh I just love this church!' and who would then go on to tell stories of how they were part of one of the various youth groups or children's groups or got married or baptised at Christ Church. Christ Church has been a place of blessing and belonging for so many years – many, many faithful people have been used by God to bring the hope of Jesus to Feltham. I've found myself looking back with gratitude to all those within the circuit, who gave a costly and sacrificial YES! to the next chapter of Christ Church – to the circuit stewards of the Feltham and Staines circuit, to the Rev'd Anne Dollery down at St Dunstons and especially to Rev'd Andrew Reed, our superintendent, who has put countless, countless hours into making the partnership happen – I am beyond

grateful. For, without your YES to this next chapter at CCF, we would not have seen all that God has written...

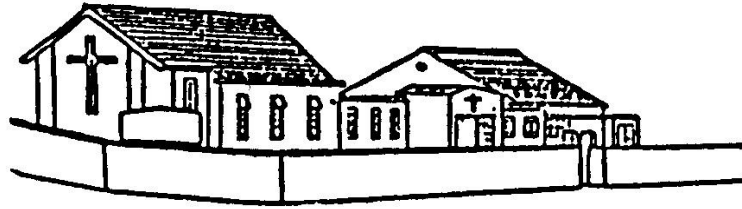
I am grateful to God, who has placed a new worshipping community at Christ Church and through that community, in partnership with this circuit; prayer has occurred, mission has taken place, worship has been conducted, the hungry have been feed, the homeless have been housed, the lonely have found friendship, the hopeless given hope and the love of God has shone around. From the Circuit Office & Beyond

Dear Friends

Already 2024 is under way. Looking around there is much going on in our world which takes our attention and it is right that this should be the case. Over the course of 2024, if things follow the expected pattern there will be a number of elections taking place all around the world. The media will focus on the most prominent of these events which no doubt will include the selection of the Prime Minister in the United Kingdom and the election of the next President of the United States of America. Each change of Government, wherever it takes place will have an impact on the course of history. Alongside these high profile events, life carries on. Nationally our Parliament continues to consider matters of vital importance; once again, making decisions that will change the way that we do things to a greater or lesser extent. Locally those who provide us with the utilities and our local Councils continue to make use of the resources that they have to meet the needs of our communities. As time goes by we see just how difficult this can be. Perhaps this is most apparent when we consider the number of Public Enquiries that are taking place which we follow as they come under the spotlight. I know that there are lots of opinions about the rights and wrongs of each situation but I also realise just how easy it is to form a view without having all the necessary information.

You will appreciate that here in the Staines and Feltham Circuit we have similar structures (although on a much smaller scale) which have responsibility to manage a wide range of issues. Some are complex and in the public view whilst others are personal and need a careful pastoral response. Here in the



Circuit we have our Church Councils, Ecumenical Church Councils, Partnerships and Deacons to oversee these matters in the local Churches. Alongside these we have members of the Circuit Leadership Team and the Circuit Meeting who have responsibility to oversee what happens. Much of what we deal with locally is also reviewed within the South East District of the Methodist Church and the Connexion, both of whom can instruct the Circuit to carry out particular functions as well.

In 2024 I would encourage you to pray not just for those in powerful positions of State all around the world, but also to bring our national Government and politicians as well as Local Councillors and Executives of companies, large and small. This is not to forget those people and organisations who have an impact on our lives day by day. It is somehow all too easy to criticise, but it is surely much better to follow the advice of St Paul who wrote this to Timothy (1 Tim 2: 1 -4)

“First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for everyone, for kings and all who are in high positions, so that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life, in all godliness and dignity. This is right and is acceptable in the sight of God our Saviour, who desires everyone to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth.”. (NRSV)

Your prayers for those with responsibility in and around the Circuit are also valued. I know that you will be aware of those matters within your local Church so do please pray for them on a regular basis. 2024 is the year when we start the process of looking for a new member of the Team. Following the Methodist procedure this means that we are due to appoint our Circuit Invitation Committee at the Circuit Meeting in February

2024. Once appointed they will begin to prayerfully determine the will of God for the Staines and Feltham Circuit. My request is that you add your prayers as well.

EDITION FOCUS

My name is Michael Bagg, I was born in a heatwave in June 1950, the youngest of four siblings, my home was in Staines (no “Upon-Thames” in that era!) for the first seven and three-quarter years of my life. At that point, the family moved to an address in Ashford, a few hundred yards from the border with Staines; the prime reason was to have access to two bus routes, rather than only one, together with two Greenline (express bus) routes, as we did not own or run a car.

The move of home brought a change in school – to Woodthorpe Road Junior School, a Victorian building with roaring fires in each classroom in the winter months. The site is now home to the Salvation Army Citadel, and whenever I go there for events the thought comes to me that, sixty-five years ago, I may have been sitting in that very spot, wearing short trousers, studying at an old-fashioned desk, complete with inkwell!

From the age of three my lovely, late sister (Evelyn) took me to afternoon Sunday School at Staines Methodist Church, then situated in Kingston Road in a cavernous Victorian building. I went from the “Beginners” Department to the “Juniors”, then the “Young People’s”, becoming a Church Member at sixteen, during Alan Cox’s incumbency. I took on the role of JMA Secretary and various other commitments in church life.

My Secondary education was at Matthew Arnold School, boys half; the other half was for the girls, and very rare was it that there was any mixing (at least during school hours). Leaving school at sixteen, I commenced work with British Rail, then being employed by that organisation for twenty-six and a half years. I moved around quite often in the early years, before settling at Waterloo. One of my early roles was in the Computer Bureau at Reading; computers had their own large room, and they stood about five feet tall, with massive-sized tapes on reels whirring round inside glass doors. Smoking was allowed anywhere in the building, except the computer room – computers were too precious to be damaged by cigarette ash and smoke!!

Thankfully, legislation banning smoking from most workplaces is how it is now, duly considering the health of the **human**.

Leaving railway employment in the run-up to privatisation, I then worked for the London Borough of Hounslow until retirement, this time staying in the same building throughout my second career. In between these two employers I, a confirmed bachelor, met the love of my life, Barbara; we celebrate 30 years of marriage this Spring.

Many of you reading this will remember my role as a Local Preacher in this Circuit. I was always a shy, retiring kind of person (and still am!), but a saintly, long-standing “Local” (David Mitchell) one day put his hand on my shoulder and told me “God is calling you to preach”. What a shock; someone who leads worship, and preaches the living word of God to many people – that was **not** what a quiet person, who was happy working “behind the scenes”, did. But that was **human** reasoning, not the way **God** can and does work. So at twenty-five years of age I took the first, tentative steps of exploring this call.

Confirmation came gradually, culminating in my “full accreditation” in November 1981. This ministry continued until the Summer of 2017, though until February 2020 I was often to be found leading the 15-minute service following the “Thursday Lunch” at Staines. Since then I have stepped back, apart from very occasionally substituting on a Sunday when an appointed preacher, in advance, advised me that they could not fulfil their appointment. My “work” in God’s Kingdom is now, in the main, “behind the scenes”.
