Dear Friends,

I thought that as the summer approached I would find that things were slowing down, but that is certainly not the case in the Staines and Feltham Circuit. As I prepare to hand on the opportunities that stand before you I take this opportunity to reflect on what is lined up. I start over at St. Jude's and the Village Centre. As I have previously shared, Rev. Judith Allford continues in a reduced role at the Church. This role is known as "House for Duty" and allows her to support the fellowship at the Church and at the Village Centre. I have enjoyed working with Judith and in sharing the growing work both at the Church and at the Centre. I was at the Centre on Friday the 23rd May 2025 to say goodbye with the staff and volunteers to Ali Griffin who has been at the Centre for seven years and in moving on to pick up new challenges and opportunities. Working with Ali has been a joy. She has encouraged the Management Committee and the staff with all sorts of new initiatives as well as ensuring that the existing work has been able to flourish. Under her careful guidance and that of the Village Centre Management Committee the premises have been maintained and refurbished to ensure that they meet the needs of the Church and the community. It has also been a real pleasure to welcome Helen Hallett as the new Manager and for the next few months I will endeavour to support her as she picks up the role and moves the Centre forward.

Coming down the hill, I am grateful for the work that goes on at the United Church of Egham. Do have a look for their Annual Report which is a fascinating read. One particular activity stands out which is the monthly Bookstall. (It is worth mentioning that the Bookstall does have an online presence as well). They raise funds for many Charities as well as supporting the Church. The team is guided by Graham Burrough who is a

fount of knowledge and inspiration. Recently four of the volunteers undertook Foundation Safeguarding Training. I am grateful for them giving up their time to do this. By the way, if anyone is involved in activities in their Churches which requires safeguarding training, there is still time to contact me before I leave at the end of August 2025. I would also like to thank Verna Doe for assisting me with the Training and for Rev. John Mackerness who was our Chaplain on this occasion.

Egham also has a significant project in mind which is in the early stages and I wish them well as they prayerfully seek the will of God for them. One piece of on-going work at Egham relates to links with Rivemede Home. Four people share a rota to go in roughly once a month to lead an act of worship. Regular Holy Communion is also offered. I am grateful to Pauline Shilston, Paul Murphy and Mandie Shirnia who is a Curate at St. John's, Egham who carry out this important and enjoyable work.

Just across the river we come to Staines. Although I am not the Minister with Pastoral Charge I have enjoyed visiting Staines over the past few years and in hearing about the work that is planned for the premises. Being part of the choir has provided me with space to reflect and to learn new pieces of music which I have really enjoyed and so I thank the members of the choir and Roz Sendoreck who has directed them all the time I have been in the Circuit.

Back on my own territory, Woodthorpe Methodist Church continues to explore what lies ahead for them. At the moment they are in the process of submitting a Planning Application for the land at Laleham. This is another exciting project which could involve Kingdom Living Church and possibly the local prison at Bronzefield.

I have enjoyed time spent with Boys' Brigade at Ashford Common where not only do I have the pleasure of leading a brief reflection on what it is to be a Christian in our world today, but then taking part in the activities for the evening. I realise how much effort goes into ensuring that that young people have a good and enjoyable evening. I shall miss this when I move away.

Moving further east we come to Southville. It is a joy to visit on a Sunday to share in fellowship and I appreciate all that the Stewards do to support me and the Local Preachers who attend to lead worship. Although I was not able to attend the Christian Aid event this year I do recall with fondness the events that I have been to with Pat and the children that we may have been looking after at the time. They are good memories and perhaps some of the things that I enjoyed will be things that I will be able to do when I move on.

I recently attended the General Church meeting at Christchurch which was fascinating with lots of really positive news about what God is doing at the Church. They have engaged with a local architect to get some ideas of how they might be able to work with the building which is in need of some attention.

I have set out just a few of the things that are happening all around the Circuit and space does not permit me to mention everything, but above all, I do not lose sight of the fact that all of our Churches have a specific purpose which is to share the message of the love of God with our neighbours and I believe that each Church is doing this. I know that so much effort goes into ensuring that services take place each week and I record my thanks to the Stewards, musicians, welcomes, Communion Stewards, Local Preachers and everyone else who plays a role in allowing us to engage with each other and our communities.

It has been my joy and privilege to be with you since 2015 and I wish you well as you continue to give effect to the ideas and initiatives that you have considered over the years. You will be working with Rev. Lansford and Deacon Jacqueline and I know that you will continue to be guided by the Holy Spirit in the coming days.

The successful candidate will work as part of a team with Circuit staff and leadership to support the work of the seven churches in the Circuit.

Blessings of peace and preservation as we journey through the month of June. Multiplied Blessings to all of you Gods faithful servants. The sent word of the Lord for June is “Guard”



GUARD

A man bought the latest home security system but forgot to close his front door.

When thieves robbed him, he complained, “The system didn’t work!”

His friend said, “You don’t just need protection; you must also participate!”

That’s how many believers are: praying for God to guard them while leaving the doors of compromise wide open!

Proverbs 4:23 (NIV UK)

“Above all else, **guard** your heart, for everything you do flows from it.”

“Be careful how you **think**; your life is shaped by your thoughts.”

Good News Translation (GNT):

“More than anything you guard, protect your **mind**, for life flows from it. Common English Bible (CEB):

In today’s fast-paced, loud, and cluttered world, what does it mean to guard your heart?

To “Guard” means to watch, protect, preserve like a **secret treasure**. It is to watch over your heart like a military sentry; to prevent **hostile invasion**.

The Bible tells us plainly: “Above all else” — before your finances, reputation, even your schedule — guard your “heart” (mind, will and emotions). Why? Because it’s the source of everything else in your life.

Your heart is the command centre of your decisions, your desires, your thoughts, and ultimately, your destiny. Just as a nation guards its borders and banks guard their vaults, you and I as believers must guard our hearts — diligently and daily.

Guarding our heart and mind means being watchful against physical, spiritual, emotional, and mental threats that can corrupt, confuse, or distract you from God’s purpose. Below are key things we need to guard against, with scriptures, explanations, and practical tips:

1. Sinful Thoughts and Desires

Scripture:

“But each one is tempted when he is drawn away by his own desires and enticed.” — James 1:14 (NKJV)

What to Guard Against:

- Lust, greed, pride, envy, revenge, and selfish ambition.

Practical Tip:

- Use Scripture like a sword. Declare verses like Matthew 5:8: “Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God.”

Catchphrase:

“Don’t let what starts in your mind become the mess in your life.”

2. Bitterness and Unforgiveness

Scripture:

“See to it that no bitter root grows up to cause trouble and defile many.” — Hebrews 12:15 (NIV UK)

What to Guard Against:

- Past hurts, offenses, grudges, and resentment.

Practical Tip:

- Forgive daily. Unforgiveness is a spiritual poison that blocks blessings.

3. Fear and Anxiety

Scripture:

“Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer... let your requests be made known to God.” — Philippians 4:6 (NKJV)

What to Guard Against:

- Worry, panic, insecurity, fear of the future or failure.

Practical Tip:

- Cast your cares in prayer. Speak God’s promises over your fears.

Quote:

“Fear tolerated is faith contaminated.” — Kenneth Copeland

4. Doubt and Unbelief

Scripture:

“Take heed, brethren, lest there be in any of you an evil heart of unbelief.” — Hebrews 3:12 (NKJV)

What to Guard Against:

- Doubting God’s love, power, promises, or timing.

Practical Tip:

- Strengthen your faith by recalling past victories and reading testimonies.

Catchphrase:

“Guard your faith like gold—it’s your access to the impossible.”

5. Wrong Influences

Scripture:

“Do not be deceived: ‘Evil company corrupts good habits.’” — 1 Corinthians 15:33 (NKJV)

What to Guard Against:

- Toxic friendships, ungodly mentors, corrupt media, worldly ideologies.

Practical Tip:

- Choose godly associations. Monitor the voices influencing your decisions.

“You absorb what you’re immersed in.”

6. Pride and Self-Reliance

Scripture:

“Pride goes before destruction, and a haughty spirit before a fall.” — Proverbs 16:18 (NKJV)

What to Guard Against:

- Arrogance, boasting, thinking you don’t need God or others.

Practical Tip:

- Humble yourself daily through obeying the word of God, worship and thanksgiving.

Quote:

“Pride is the only disease that makes everyone sick including the one who has it.”

7. Lies of the Enemy

Scripture:

“You belong to your father, the devil... there is no truth in him.”
— John 8:44 (NIV UK)

What to Guard Against:

- Identity lies (e.g. “You’re worthless”, “God doesn’t love you”, “You’ll never change”).

Practical Tip:

- Identify and replace lies with truth from God’s Word.

Catchphrase:

“Don’t accept the enemy’s narrative when God already wrote your story.”

8. Impatience and Haste

Scripture:

“He who believes will not act hastily.” — Isaiah 28:16b (NKJV)

What to Guard Against:

- Rushing decisions, impulsive actions, or frustration with God’s timing.

Practical Tip:

- Slow down. Wait on the Lord. Seek counsel.

A burnt meal from rushing—“Haste makes waste, even in destiny.”

9. Comparison and Envy

Scripture:

“For where envy and self-seeking exist, confusion and every evil thing are there.” — James 3:16 (NKJV)

What to Guard Against:

- Jealousy of others 'success, possessions, appearance, or calling.

Practical Tip:

- Focus on your God-given race. Celebrate others genuinely.

Catchphrase:

“When you look sideways, you lose your way forward.”

10. Distraction and Double-mindedness

Scripture:

“A double-minded man is unstable in all his ways.” — James 1:8 (KJV)

“Let us lay aside every weight...” — Hebrews 12:1 (NKJV)

What to Guard Against:

- Divided attention, scattered priorities, and spiritual dullness.

Practical Tip:

- Re-establish spiritual disciplines and clear your schedule for God.

Quote:

“If the devil can’t destroy you, he’ll distract you.”

IN SUMMARY

1. Guard your HEART — with the Word of God.

“Keep your heart with all diligence...” (Proverbs 4:23)

2. Guard your MIND — with truth.

“Bringing every thought into captivity...” (2 Corinthians 10:5)

3. Guard your MOUTH — with wisdom.

“He who guards his mouth preserves his life...” (Proverbs 13:3)

4. Guard your TIME — with purpose.

“Redeeming the time, for the days are evil...” (Ephesians 5:16)

5. Guard your RELATIONSHIPS — with discernment.

“Evil company corrupts good habits.” (1 Corinthians 15:33)

Closing Thought:

“The quality of your life is determined by the condition of your heart.”

Guard it like your future depends on it — because it does.

Stay watchful. Stay worshipful. Stay guarded. – The Guard Post Team

Final Declaration:

“I am not careless with my heart, my mind, my mouth, or my mission!

I am divinely guarded. I am spiritually posted. I walk with angels. I guard what matters. I win by watching!”

Grace, mercy and love be multiplied to you and your family, our church family our nation and the nations of the world this new month of June.

**“A Strange Warmth:
The Aldersgate Experience of John Wesley”**

What Happened at Aldersgate?

Date: Wednesday, 24 May 1738

Location: Aldersgate Street, London

Event: Wesley goes from head faith to heart fire of love.

John Wesley, discouraged and uncertain of his salvation from sin (yes—even the future founder of Methodism had doubts!), attended a Moravian meeting. Someone read from Martin Luther’s preface to Romans, and then it happened...

Wesley wrote in his journal:

“About a quarter before nine, while he was describing the change which God works in the heart through faith in Christ, I felt my heart strangely warmed. I felt I did trust in Christ, Christ alone, for salvation...”

Has your heart being strangely warmed?

**“WWJDW?” –
What Would John Wesley Do?”**

Welcome to the world of John Wesley, where holiness meets horsepower (yes, he once rode 250,000 miles on horseback to share Jesus!). If you’ve ever wanted to live like Wesley, here’s your revival-ready, Holy-Spirit-fueled, guide.

1. Embrace His Core Beliefs

- Justification by faith: it is important to have faith in the cleansing blood of Jesus. Ask the blood of Christ to cleanse you from all sin. When we are washed by the blood of Christ we are justified -Just as if you have never sinned. Believe that you are saved from sin through faith in the blood of Jesus Christ.
- Sanctification: invite the Holy Spirit into your heart to warm it divine love. Pursue holiness and Christian perfection—total love for God and others.
- Use Scripture, tradition, reason, and experience to form your understanding of God (theology). Known as the “Wesleyan Quadrilateral”

Prayer Blessed Holy Spirit, warm my heart with Your love. Help me to walk right by the scriptures. Assure me that I am Yours and You are mine

2. Live a Disciplined Life

Wesley was methodical—that’s how Methodism got its name. Follow his personal rules:

WAKE UP HOLY – “When the Cock Crows, So Should You!”

- Wake up early for prayer and Bible study. He was up early (4-5AM)
- Fast regularly (usually Wednesdays and Fridays until 3 PM or Fast as your health or strength will allow).
- Keep a daily journal to reflect on spiritual growth and accountability.
- Avoid luxury and waste—live simply, give generously.

Modern Christian: “I’m fasting social media.”

Wesley: “Try fasting mutton and ale, Friend.”

3. Witness Like Wesley

- Don't wait for people to come to church—go where the people are, in fields, pubs, prisons, and the occasional angry mob.
- Use clear, passionate language that even common people can understand.
- Share about repentance, grace, assurance of salvation, holiness, and heaven/hell.
- “Set yourself on fire, and people will come to watch you burn.”

Quote of the month:

“Give me one hundred believers (preachers) who fear nothing but sin and desire nothing but God...” —John Wesley

Wesley shows up with a Bible in one hand and a flame in his eyes. Someone whispers, “Who let Elijah in again?”

4. Serve Like Wesley

Quote:

“Do all the good you can, by all the means you can, in all the ways you can...” —John Wesley's life motto

- Serve to the poor, sick, and prisoners.
- Start or attend small groups (like his “class meetings”) for accountability, study, and spiritual growth.
- Use your gifts and encourage others to preach and serve.

Wesley at the mall:

Cashier: “Would you like to sign up for our rewards card?”

Wesley: “I seek only heavenly rewards, madam.”

5. Adopt Wesley's Catchphrases

- "The world is my parish."
- "Earn all you can, save all you can, give all you can."
- "Do all the good you can..."
- "I felt my heart strangely warmed..." (his Aldersgate experience)

6. Dress Simply

- Be modest and humble in appearance.
 - No wigs. No gold rings. No Gucci robes. Haha 😊

8. Pray and Study Like Wesley

- Read the Bible daily—especially early morning and before bed.
- Memorize Scripture.
- Use liturgical prayers and spontaneous ones.
- Engage in theological reading—especially Church Fathers and Reformers.

Closing Quote:

"I am not afraid that the people called Methodists should ever cease to exist... but that they should exist as a dead sect, having the form of religion without the power."

—John Wesley (a revivalist with receipts)
