



On my travels around the Staines and Feltham Circuit over the past few months I have enjoyed meeting with people from the Churches where I do not have local involvement. I know that this happens just occasionally, but it does not alter the fact that I take an active interest in what is happening around the Circuit. The Methodist Church encourages members to review what has taken place at Conference each year and I have actually shared some of what has happened with some of you over the past few weeks. For those of you who I have not been able to do this,

please visit the Methodist Church website and download the Conference Digest (<https://www.methodist.org.uk/about-us/the-methodist-conference/conference-2019/the-conference-business-digest/>) which might whet your appetite for more information. I am sure that many of you are aware of one of the main topics considered this year which is contained in the Report on marriage and relationships entitled, “God in Love Unites Us”. This is a long report accompanied by a Study Guide. Ghana project – update

As described in the last newsletter, I attended the opening of the Karen Slowe Junior High School, Akokoa, Ghana in August.

We were part of a group of 14 ‘special’ visitors including some from Norway, Germany, Canada, South Africa and UK. Three coaches picked us up from our hotel and we wound our way through Accra picking up employees and volunteers from Projects Abroad who are behind the charity and the players, family and friends from Cantonments Football club which is also attached to the company.

On arrival in the hills where Akokoa is located, we transferred to taxis to transport us to the village.

The youngest children from the primary school were sitting waiting, but there was no sign of the rest of the village! Eventually everyone was gathered and the opening ceremony began. There were speeches from Karen’s family and the director of the school, plus drama and music from the school children, and dancing from the villagers. When the school had been officially opened, we all made a tour before moving up the hill for an incredible lunch. The estimated number of people fed was around 500 some of whom had come from surrounding villages.

In the afternoon, there was a tree planting ceremony at the primary school with more speeches and contributions from the children. This was followed by a football match on a pitch that was on an incline with a less than perfect surface – not surprisingly the home team won!

It was a bitter sweet occasion seeing the school and the amazing work that is being done there, but sad that Karen was not there to see it. The contributions of Lego, children's shoes and football boots and books which I took with me were greatly appreciated and will be put to good use.

At Ashford, we held a Harvest breakfast to raise funds for the school – in particular to contribute to a Christmas meal 'with meat' – and raised an incredible £175.




