As I write we are now enjoying a much fresher weather with rains. Lately the weather was unkindly hot even me coming from Africa where the sun is hot could not cope with the heat.

The 2018 Methodist Conference was held at the University of Nottingham. I went to attend the opening Conference Worship Services with my daughter Rudado. Rev Michaela A Youngson was inducted President and her theme address for the year is “Radical Grace”.

The good news is that there were four Zimbabwean Ministers who were ordained and being received in the Methodist Conference. We went to support them. It also gave me an opportunity to meet with my colleagues whom I trained with and to visit family in the North.

Back home, the Circuit has been very quiet. In all the churches the work of God continues, Sunday Worship, fellowships, Pastoral care and all the other events that take place on a day to day basis. I wish to thank most sincerely, the Circuit Leadership Team, the Church Stewards, Pastoral Leaders and all who hold important

roles, for your commitment to the work of the Kingdom. As you all know Rev Andrew Reed is back from Sabbatical Leave on the 3<sup>rd</sup> of September 2018. I am looking forward to his coming and hoping he had a fruitful, invigorating space of time.

However, I will just give a summarised update of what is happening in our Circuit.

- Christ Church conversations about the Sharing Agreement with the Anglican Church Plant is work in progress.
- Ashford Methodist and Laleham Methodist Churches are in the exploration mode about the future. Both Churches continue to have joint services of worship at Ashford.
- Southville Methodist Church need to be commended they have done much work to the front garden and it looks beautiful.
- Ashford Common Methodist Church is preparing to Baptise and confirm one adult and baptise a baby. We are all delighted for this to happen, these are signs of church growth.
- Staines Methodist Church had a three day” holiday at home” at the beginning of August. The event seemed to have been well attended.
- Virginia Water Methodist Church is being advertised for sale.
- Village Centre is looking for reasonable funding for the door key system.

- Wendover Road Methodist Church will cease to worship at the end of August 2018. The church will be opened for another year for Bible Study, Prayer meetings, Badminton and for other Circuit events. The Montessori nursery school will use the premises for one year. The final service at Wendover Road is to be held on the 16<sup>th</sup> September 2018 at 18:30pm. The service is to be led by Rev David Alderman.
- Englefield Green (St Jude's) They are in the process of looking for a Vicar.

The Presbyterial Synod is going to be held at Staines Methodist Church on the 21<sup>st</sup> of March 2019.

Now that the holiday season seems to be coming to an end, shall we greet September for the month of transition that she is, a month that both reaffirms and enthuses as we pass into the forthcoming autumn. Let us enjoy the steadfastness of our faith as we take reassurance from the steady rhythms of the continuing Ordinary Season of the year before the excitement of Advent. ## **As the deer longs for streams of water, so I long for you, O God.**

Maggie Netto writes . . .

After a very busy period at work it was a delight to spend a weekend with my sister Mandie and her husband, Alan, at their home in Buckfastleigh on the edge of Dartmoor.

As they were both working on the Friday I decided to walk up and over the hill to Buckfast Abbey – a walk of about 12 minutes. I thought I had timed my journey just right to fall in between the frequent rain showers – all was well until I reached the very top of the hill! Damp, but encouraged by the downhill section, I soon reached my destination.



My first stop was Buckfast Methodist Chapel which is where Mandie and Alan worship. Since September 2017 they have been part of the Teignbridge Circuit. They have a service every Sunday at 3:00pm and enjoy hosting many visitors through the year. The Chapel is open every day from morning till evening.

It was established in 1881 when at a quarterly meeting of Buckfastleigh Wesleyan Methodist Church resolved “that a plot of land be purchased at Buckfast and a chapel erected thereon.”

The Chapel now stands in the middle of the Buckfast Abbey complex, but originally it sat alongside a road running through the village of Buckfast and the Abbey was a neighbouring ruin. All the buildings which now form the Abbey complex have grown-up around it.

I spent a about half an hour in quiet prayer and reflection in the small, simple, but beautiful chapel. It is a peaceful haven, a “thin place”,



soaked in prayer and I left to explore the grounds and the Abbey feeling spiritually refreshed and physically drier than when I arrived.

2018 sees Buckfast Abbey celebrating its Millennium – being 1000 years since the foundation charter was given by King Cnut granting Buckfast Abbey legal status. The weekend I happened along they were holding a festival of bell ringing. When the abbey was closed by King Henry VIII in 1539 its bells were sold to the people of Buckfastleigh for £33 15s. The bells were later recast in the 18<sup>th</sup> Century and reside in the tower of the derelict Anglican church of Holy Trinity Buckfastleigh. As part of the Festival the bells of the two towers – Holy Trinity Buckfastleigh and Buckfast Abbey - were rung together for the first time ever providing a unique opportunity to hear the bells of the medieval abbey (recast) alongside those of the restored Abbey.

In the Abbey grounds there were two large marquees containing an exhibition about the Bells of Buckfast Abbey and some great archive images of them being installed. The Health & Safety Executive would have had a field day! The exhibition

was manned by an enthusiastic team of local bell ringers from Kingsteignton and I was greeted warmly by Nigel, originally from Slough, who patiently answered all my very novice questions about bellringing.




The Abbey has a peal of 15 bells; a full peal of 12 plus 2 semitones and a Bourdon bell. Each bell has a name and is a different weight. The Bourdon bell is named 'Hosanna' and weighs a massive 7.5 tonnes.

Fortunately for me they had a mini ring on display. This is a smaller set of bells that

work much like they would normally in a bell tower but mean that you are able to ring the bells and see them move at the same time. Nigel was very keen that I should have a go at learning the basics of bell ringing on the Bowerdon Peal mini ring. All I can say is it's akin to rubbing your tummy and patting your head at the same time and I'm not very good at that either! Nigel was a good, patient teacher and I did enjoy it but I don't think I'll be taking up bellringing any time soon.

As the weather improved, I moved on to the Abbey gardens which are beautiful. A real sense of peace and tranquillity surrounds you as you stroll between the different areas of the Lavender garden, the Physic garden, the Sensory garden and the Millennium garden with the wonderful sculpture of the deer drinking at the pool engraved with the words of Psalm 42.



The Abbey church itself is a very impressive building but my favourite part by far is the Blessed Sacrament Chapel at the rear featuring the huge stained-glass window created in 1968 by Dom Charles Norris, a British monk, who trained at the Royal College of Art. His work can be seen throughout the Abbey but the

window is simply stunning and as the sunlight moves across the window it somehow comes alive. Understandably no photography is allowed in this Holy space but visitors are welcome to enter to pray.

I had a wonderfully uplifting day at Buckfast and I would encourage anyone visiting the area to put it at the top of their list.

As I made my way back up the hill towards Mandie and Alan's house, in the afternoon sunshine, I couldn't resist pausing at the top to take in one of my favourite views and to my delight Nigel and his team were ringing the Abbey tower bells.



A glorious sight and sound – God be praised!


