

In a word I wish to thank you most sincerely for the opportunity to exercise my Ministry in this Circuit. You have been part of my life, journey and story- I say this from my heart and I am eternally grateful. ## From the Circuit Office and Beyond



Dear Friends

We come to the final letter from the Circuit Office for this Connexional Year. A lot has happened over the past twelve months and I am very happy to confirm that the final part of the jigsaw for the year which is the Partnership Agreement with the Diocese of Kensington, has been agreed by all the parties. We are now looking to place the relationship on a firmer footing as we move forward together in serving the community around Christ Church.

In my previous letter I wrote that I wondered what matters I would be able to bring to your attention in the next Connexional Year. I need not have worried as all the Churches in the Circuit continue to find things that need to be processed. Whilst I tend to concentrate on the Eastern side of the Circuit in these letters it is worth mentioning that on the Western side other plans have either come to fruition or are well on the way. I start with the Village Centre which has been refurbished. If you have not been up to the Centre recently it is well worth a visit. You will also have the opportunity to sample the new menu.

In April the Rev. Alan Wickens retired. He and his wife, Anthea have now moved to pastures new and it was good that folk from around the Circuit were able to share in his final service at Egham and to have fellowship at the lunch provided by folk at

the Church afterwards Many of you will be aware that I have now taken responsibility for the United Church of Egham I am enjoying getting to know the congregation. So far as the building is concerned, the façade has recently been cleaned and various other property matters have been addressed whilst some still need to be finalised.

As I take up a new role in Egham, I lay one down at Staines. From the 1<sup>st</sup> September 2022 Rev. Kofi Tekyi-Ansah takes on Pastoral Charge for the congregation at Staines. Phases 1 and 2 of the refurbishment of Staines is not due to be completed until later in the month of September, but when the Church opens I am sure that the alterations will be of benefit to everyone who uses the premises.

The Manse in Feltham is also in need of refurbishment and this is taking place over the summer which means that Rev. Juliet Ushewokunze has kindly agreed to vacate the Manse a little earlier than we might have expected. This will enable us to upgrade the bathroom and the kitchen in particular, but we will also be able to carry out other works in and around the building.

All of the works that I have mentioned require considerable input from a large number of people to ensure that we comply with procedures, rules and regulations. Once again, I am grateful to everyone who worked so hard to ensure that these projects have worked (reasonably) smoothly and have been completed on time and in accordance with the budget set of each matter. I do however realise that the work on the Manse will not have started by the time you get this letter, but my hope and prayer is that, like the other projects, all will work according to plan.

Finally, I know that we will have had an opportunity to say goodbye to Juliet and Rudado on the 19<sup>th</sup> June when we met at

Woodthorpe (Edinburgh Drive), but I want to take this opportunity to record my thanks to Juliet for her support and help over the past five years as she has engaged with the Churches where she has had responsibility for that time. Juliet has been a blessing to many people and I include myself in that group as she has shared her views and thoughts with me and as we have sought to work together to extend the Kingdom of God in his area. Rudado has also been visible around the Circuit in her role as a Local Preacher and once again, we have benefitted from the gifts and skills that she has shared with us. I wish them both well as they move on and that they will know that God is with them each step of the way.

## **WHAT IS SYNOD LIKE?**

Twice a year there is a meeting of Synod in each of the Districts within the Connexion of the Methodist church.

The Staines and Feltham Circuit is part of the South East District which covers the counties of Kent, East and West Sussex and parts of Surrey, Berkshire and Hampshire as well as Malta and Gibraltar. Next year Malta will be celebrating 200 years of Methodism.

Synod met in High Cross church, Camberley on Saturday 30<sup>th</sup> April. There were the usual refreshments served as people arrived and there was much chatting as this was the first meeting of Synod solely face to face for two years, a day to remember.

At 10.30am the formal aspect of the day began with a time of worship lead by the Chair, Rev Dr David Hinchliffe. The theme of the day was 'Who is my neighbour?' and David Hinchliffe challenged us to think about the gospel as contextual but what is the context.

This was followed by general Synod Business which was made livelier by the arrival of a stray pigeon who manage to join the meeting through a high-level window.

There followed a very interesting and informative presentation, via a zoom link, from Rev. Dr. Inderjit Boghal, past President of the Methodist Conference and founder and President of City of Sanctuary. He talked about his work with refugees and particularly his visit to a wrecked refugees boat exhibition where he had collected a piece of rope which he was wearing as a stole, some wood which he had made into a cross and an odd sock to symbolise the plight of the refugees and our response to their plight. We were asked to ponder the idea of what response would Mary and

Joseph have received if they had arrived by boat rather than travelling on a donkey.

Following this thought provoking session we heard from Rev Hazel Forecast and Rev Dr Bonni-Belle Pickard and Rev David Fu about the work going on in the heart of the South-East District with migrants, refugees and displaced people and how Mother Tongue Churches were growing in number. In the Woking Circuit there is considerable work with integrating the Chinese community.

Then it was time for a break and as it was a sunny day many people adjourned to outside tables and the steps of the church for a sandwich lunch.

More informative talks followed after lunch. Rev. Dr. Paul Glass spoke about Methodist schools and ways of engaging with local schools in our communities. Rev Margaret Dudley talked about Rural Churches and the difficulties they face which were in some ways no different to some of the small inner-city Churches.


Then followed Financial Statements and Treasurers reports from the District Treasurer, Pauline Newton. This was followed by District Council Business with an exciting and entertaining introduction to the two newly appointed Equality, Diversity and Inclusion Officers (EDI) and their rainbow lego. Their remit is to enthuse others about the kind of inclusive Methodist Church that we believe God wants us to be which they certainly did.

We then had an opportunity to welcome the new deacons and presbyters and to say thank you to those sitting down which included our own Rev. Juliet Ushewokunze.

The day ended with closing devotions.

I first met Jean at Ashford Bowling Club, nearly twenty years ago, she was a wonderful bowler and a joy have as a skip on the green, always encouraging and fun. Some of Jean's bowling achievements were that she was Ladies Captain in 2000 and 2001, Ladies Club Champion in 2005 and 2008, and held the prestigious post of Middlesex County Ladies President in 2006.

We became friends on and off the green, and shared a room, very often twice a year, on a number of bowls holidays. To

When we stayed at Potters in January each year we would both enjoy the crafting; ceramic painting, card making, towel folding (the elephant was an interesting creation), and other activities like quizzes, tai chi, crazy golf, table tennis, dance classes, massage chairs (yes there were lots of giggles when we tried these, just the once!), and even Segways (I have a lovely video of a very calm driver, with a huge smile on her face).



On the County Tours each September we got involved with the treasure hunts, dingbats, quizzes and Jean took part in the end of tour County Executive shows, but 'what happens on tour, stays on tour!' There are so many

memories of Jean's performances; I was so very grateful to Liz in 2018 when Jean was to do a 'name that tune quiz' playing her keyboard. Liz provided me with some of the names of the tunes, we would never have guessed some that Jean played in the style of Les Dawson! There were some very, very funny sketches..... no perhaps that story is not for now but there was so much laughing that it led to Jean making a dash to the closest toilet with Sally in hot pursuit!

Sharing a room on holidays with Jean gave us lots of time to talk and share news about our families, of which Jean was obviously proud.

Jean enjoyed people watching and would give me a sharp nudge to the ribs with an elbow and say 'here, did you see that?'

We both enjoyed our walks on the beach at Hopton-on-Sea and very often we were both lost in our own thoughts and just enjoying each-others company, the sea and the view.

How can I close my eulogy for Jean? There is only one way, if Jean bowled a wood which was off course, heavy, short, pushed an opposition wood into the head for shot, there was one word that we would all hear across the green and it was said with a slight raise of her skirt – 'knickers'
