



FROM OUR MINISTER



Dear Friends,

Dear Friends,

Last Sunday on the 9th of June, we celebrated the end of Eastertide which comes at Pentecost, one of the most important celebration of the Christian Calendar, for it marks the birth of the Church.

The Lord commanded his disciples, do not leave Jerusalem. But wait for the gift my Father promised, which you heard me speak about. At Pentecost, the fiery baptism of the Holy Spirit came, to which John the Baptist looked forward to being fulfilled. The disciples were equipped for their mission with tongues of fire and rushing wind, just as the physical coming of the Holy Spirit upon Lord Jesus in bodily form of a dove, equipped him for his ministry. The disciples interpreted Pentecost as the fulfilment of Joel's prophecy about the availability of the Holy Spirit in the last days. The disciples were open to the Holy Spirit. Peter boldly expressed that salvation was for all who called on the name of the Lord.

On Friday at Ashford Methodist Church, we tried to relive the experience of the coming of the Holy Spirit in Messy Church, the children made wind blowers, to depict tongues of fire and rushing wind.

So, we created the atmosphere of Pentecost of being quiet in the moment and then asking the children to blow their wind blowers. There was such power and a great noise, the roof was about to come off!! Some of the children were jumping about, they blew with all their mighty. The amazing thing is, it was

difficult to stop them. Only the idea of food stopped them. As they left the building they went home continuing to blow. They were very much open to the Holy Spirit. It seemed they understood what Pentecost is all about. Here I experience that the Spirit of God is very active in the affairs of man. There was great passion and energy in the children's blowing. Even the Church cannot have its own terms without reference to God's life-giving Spirit.

Like the Messy Church children, are we ready to have our way illumined by the Spirit fire and be blown into unexpected areas of Mission for Christ?

Now coming to the re-alignment process, there is a lot of work going on behind the scenes as to the future of our Churches. Consultants working for the Methodist Church Connexion visited again some of our church buildings and made suggestions for future developments, including Ashford Common and Southville Methodist Churches. The Christ Church Partnership documentation remains work in progress. We expect further news of these potential developments at the next Circuit Meeting. The decisions with the London District on re-alignment would then be probably available.

The work of God continues in all our Churches, worship, learning and caring, service and evangelism.

Ashford and Laleham continue to have combined Services of worship. The service at Laleham at the beginning of this month 2nd of June was significant. We had a Baptism of Jonjoe Carter Blundell one-year old son of Marc and Shannon Blundell. Jonjoe was in the moment very interested in what was going on

around him. The service was well attended by their families and friends. We congratulate and thank Marc and Shannon for taking that special step of faith to bring their son to be Baptised. We pray that Jonjoe will grow up under Christ's Light and enjoy good health and life in all its fullness.



The hospitality team at Laleham made the Baptism very special. They went out of their way as always to set tables and offer refreshment. This team does it well. Thank you for your warm welcome, kind and generous spirit. Everyone appreciated.

FROM OUR SUPERINTENDENT MINISTERS OFFICE AND BEYOND

Dear all,

I am writing to you in the middle of June and I remind myself that this time last year I had just started my Sabbatical. It all now seems just a distant memory. The main thing I notice is that the weather so far this year is somewhat different with a whole lot more rain. However, the bulk of the summer still lies ahead and hopefully we will get the expected sunshine is due course. I like to remind myself of the fact that God has promised us a regular cycle each year which sustains us and the planet on which we live. I have watched the various protests over the past few months that have expressed concern about the way that we treat our planet and once again, I remind myself that God made it clear right at the beginning that we all have responsibility to care for our world. (Genesis 2: 15). Now that we live in a global world it is easier to see the impact that our individual actions have around the globe. We really do need to take God's instruction seriously and of course this

extends beyond nature and also affects the way that we relate to each other; both in our families, in the community and within the Church. They are very hopeful that we can meet the target of re-aligning the Circuits on 1st September 2020. In the meantime, please carry on praying for the Circuit Leadership Team as negotiations continue.

I would like to take this opportunity to let you know that Rev. Canon Judith Allford has been appointed Vicar at St. Jude’s United Church, Englefield Green and I am sure that her presence will be a tremendous blessing to the people who meet at the Church and those who attend the Village Centre.

Finally, I am grateful for all the work that you do in the local Churches of the Eastern End and pray that God will bless all that is done in His Name.

May you continue to experience the peace of God in the coming days.
