FROM OUR MINISTER



Dear Friends,

I come to write this letter with mixed feelings of sorrow and joy. Yes, I am standing in that place of sorrow and tears because of COVID19. I was hoping the year 2021 would be a time of restoration from the difficulties we experienced and endured last year. Unfortunately COVID 19 came with a vengeance in 2021 and started claiming lives at high levels, the world over hospitals could not cope with the

large numbers of those infected, even in my country Zimbabwe and South Africa too, the hospitals were full. During the month of January, 2021 my family lost 5 people to COVID 19 and my nephew Tatenda Ndoro 30 years old was found dead here in London in his flat. The Police found him sleeping in his bed, no signs of anything suspicious and the Coroner, has defined the death as natural causes and released the body, arrangements are now being made to take him for burial to Zimbabwe Wedza where we come from. Tatenda was a radiographer, a responsible young man active in the Methodist Church in Zimbabwe fellowship working with Youth. These relatives passed on so quickly that we are just shocked and stunned, we could not travel to go and attend the funerals. As Christians, we look at David who encouraged himself, when he had lost everything at Ziglag (1Sam. 30:6). Yes, we grieve but our sorrow contains the seed of hope. Our hope is in anticipation of eternal life with Christ. However, the good news is the vaccine is now a reality, many people are being injected every day. Hopefully, this will eradicate COVID 19 completely from our midst, and we will not require Lockdowns.

On the Eastern side of the Circuit all our churches are closed. There are no activities taking place in the churches. We are waiting for the Government guidelines to get us out of Tier 4.

On a positive note, the great news which gave me joy is the merger of Ashford and Laleham Methodist Churches as Woodthorpe Methodist Church worshipping in two places. This was formally endorsed at the Circuit Meeting on Monday 8th February, 2021. God is faithful, He journeyed with us, as He did with the children of Israel in the

wilderness, sometimes we were oblivious to all that was happening but God Almighty knew the way, for he is the way and took us by His mighty hand to Woodthorpe Methodist Church. It is now a reality. All I can say, God is a miracle working God and all things are possible with Him, his Spirit walks with his Church. I would like to thank most sincerely, the Ashford and Laleham Methodist Churches- communities who worked tireless with great patience and commitment to bring about this merger. God bless you all for listening to what the Spirit of God was saying to you as His “Sacred Church”, which He bought with His blood.

All our churches are worshipping via Zoom, watching BBC Services, Reflections and all other means of worship accessible to us. Tomorrow is the first Sunday in Lent. The season the Church invites us to make that inward journey, a time to evaluate the way we live, and who we think we truly are. Lent provides a season of conversion, a turning, a returning to God revealed to us in Lord Jesus Christ. Often, we stray from the centre of our being, getting caught up in distractions that divide our hearts and Souls. It is God who keeps us in the desired goal. Lent gives us the opportunity to start again, it is a time of reflection- deepening our spiritual lives to draw near to God.

Joel reminds us,” return to God with all your heart “(Joel 2:12). We do this by putting into practise three disciplines prayer, fasting and almsgiving (Matt. 6 1-6,16-18).

In prayer we lift our minds and hearts to God who loves us and gave us Lord Jesus his beloved Son. By fasting we train our wills to do the will of God, also standing with the poor, who are always hungry. And by Almsgiving, we reach out to those in need through financial assistance and social service. Bonhoeffer said, it is not the religious act that makes us Christians- but participation in the suffering of God in the life of the world. It is not sufficient just to do these things, we need to do them in a certain way, whole heartedly.

What type of activities that engage your whole heart? Of the three Lenten disciplines prayer, fasting, almsgiving- which one do you feel is important for you? What will be your response?

Prayer: Lord as we are in this holy season of Lent, send your Holy Spirit and hope into our hearts. Too often our hearts are divided, our minds

are distracted, help us to focus on doing your will and building your Kingdom. May this season of Lent help us to grow in our discipleship.

From the Circuit Office – and Beyond

Dear Friends

I am not sure that I expected to be in the situation that we are currently facing back at the beginning of the year. I know that it has been a challenging two months for many of us.

I am really grateful for the work that has been done all around the Circuit to enable us to comply with the regulations relating to the Coronavirus. Even though Churches have been allowed to continue to operate, I think that the decision taken by Churches around the Circuit to remain closed was a sensible one. Another meeting of the Covid-19 Group for the Circuit will have taken place following the announcement by the Prime Minister on the 22nd February 2021 and I am sure that this will help in taking decisions about opening up our premises for people to worship face to face at some point in the not too distant future.

I am so pleased that so many folk have been able to attend services via Zoom and I am grateful for everyone who has worked so hard to make this possible with contributions from around the Circuit, input from Local Preachers, Worship Leaders and our Ministers. However, I do

need to offer special thanks to Roz, Matt, the Stewards and the support Team at Staines for their efforts each week.

Once again, it is important to let you know that the work of the Circuit and local Churches has not stopped. This time I want to recognise the work of the Circuit Leadership Team. Many of the topics that are dealt with at Circuit Meetings and Church Councils have been considered by the CLT who are able to advise and assist our local Churches so that when applications are presented they are able to proceed without too much difficulty. Jonathan in particular has spent much time on tidying up our applications on the Property Consent website and has gained so much helpful information and he is very happy to share it with anyone who needs to set up an application on the website. He also looks after quinquennials and financial matters and ensures that I deal with things that need my attention at the right time. We are deeply indebted to him and I express my thanks for his support. Other members of CLT review technical emails from our Lawyers relating to the sale of buildings and the granting of licences and leases, tenancy agreements and the re-issuing of the Circuit Directory which is due to take place later this year. Sue also makes sure that things like the Plan and DBS checks and training courses are monitored and managed and without this support my task would be a lot more complicated.

Usually I give an update on projects around the Circuit, but I have run out of space, so suffice it to state that Churches are making use of the offset assessment money to good effect and if you want to find out about the exciting projects in the Circuit please get in touch with me or your local Stewards.

I hope that you have a very happy Easter.

A view into the world of Staines and Feltham Circuit

A bit of history

The concept of mutual support within a local group of churches was developed in the time of John Wesley. They were called 'societies' at the outset. By the late 18th Century the Methodist churches had formed local groups which were called 'Circuits' and functioned for the mutual support of mission, finance and ministry, just as they do now.

The organisation of the Circuit

Our Circuit generally meets three times a year and consists of clergy, the Circuit Leadership team and representatives from each church within the Circuit. The Clergy of the Staines and Feltham Circuit are currently Rev Andrew Reed as Superintendent and has pastoral charge of Staines and Wendover Road churches. Andrew also works in conjunction with Rev Judith Allford at St Jude's Church, Englefield Green and oversees the work and administration of the Village Centre, Englefield Green; Rev Juliet Ushewokunze is responsible for Ashford, Laleham, (now known as Woodthorpe Methodist Church) Southville and Ashford Common churches and is involved at Christchurch, Feltham; Rev Alan Wickens for Egham United Reform Church; Rev Canon Judith Allford for St Jude's Church, Englefield Green; Rev Andy Watkins for the congregation which currently meets at Christ Church, Feltham under the jurisdiction of the Anglican church and Rev Julie Underwood our supernumerary minister. The Circuit Leadership team are Marilyn Woodley, Maggie Netto, Jonathan Griffiths, Roger Griffiths and Pauline Shilston.

Andrew and the Circuit Leadership team complete documentation that is requested by the District and ensures that record keeping complies with Methodist and government regulations. The documentation includes financial records, safeguarding records and applications to the District for their approval of building works to any Methodist property in the circuit. These applications are known as Property Consents. Applications have to be made for work to manses, churches and property that is owned by the circuit but currently let. At Circuit meetings everyone is updated with the property consents from the respective churches and thus provides the local church support that was identified nearly 300 years ago.

Individual churches can apply to the Circuit for a grant or financial support for building work. An explanation of the project is given at the Circuit meeting and then the request for the grant is made and a vote by the members of the Circuit meeting is taken. At the most recent meeting there were requests for a number of grants, two of which are considerable. All applications were approved unanimously. The projects at the Village Centre, Englefield Green and at Staines are the two largest and focus on the extensive development of the respective premises for the future. The additional challenge of the Village Centre project is the need for the building work to comply with the Listed Building Status of the building.

The selling of church buildings has taken up a great deal of Andrew and CLT's time recently due to the legal and Connexional complexities of conveyancing – we know what it is like to buy and sell a house – there is usually only one legal framework to work within!

Ministry is another strand of the work of the Circuit meeting.

Annually an "Invitations Committee" is appointed in case a need arises for a minister to be replaced. The procedure for appointing a new minister follows a very interesting but tightly structured procedure.

The Circuit is also responsible for overseeing the training of those who feel called to be a Local Preacher and the ongoing professional development of Local Preachers.

There are many more aspects of Circuit work but I can also assure you that there are also surprises, one never knows what is round the corner!!

Woodthorpe

On the 8th of February 2021 something new was born, called into existence for such a time as this: Woodthorpe Methodist Church. For more years than I care to remember, Ashford and Laleham Methodist Churches have been tossing the idea of joining together to and fro, originally under the guidance of the late Rev Peter Clark, then taken up by Rev Juliet Ushewokunze, but the idea seemed to drive itself into a ditch. The main problem was that there were two buildings a mile and a half apart and one of them had to go. After a while it was suggested that we keep both sites going and refer to ourselves as “One Church Worshipping in Two Places”. This gave us something to get our teeth into, and we got someone from the District to come and assess the situation in each church location and things looked hopeful for a while, but several reports and Church Council meetings later, the flame flickered and went out. Eventually, after some thought and much prayer, Rev Juliet decided to give it another go, and the project miraculously took off. There was a new spirit among all concerned, a determination to make it work. A new name was chosen, the necessary documentation drawn up, District approval received etc. etc. and at the February Circuit meeting Woodthorpe became a reality.

Now when God gives someone a name, that name has to mean something, and it usually has to do with the circumstances into which they are born, and the purpose for which they are called.

Why Woodthorpe ? The Road has a number of good joining features.

- 1) As you travel along that road, you are taking the most direct route between the Ashford site and the Laleham one. Woodthorpe Road actually joins two communities : the town of Ashford and the area on and around the Royal Estate.
- 2) The road goes over the river Ash and under the A308, again forming a link between two areas.
- 3) While you are going along Woodthorpe Road you will find, for instance, a railway station, two churches (Anglican and Salvation Army), a tennis club, a large prison (Bronzefield), playing fields with children's play area, a community centre, many houses and a park.
- 4) The Laleham site falls within Churches Together in Staines and Laleham, while the Ashford site belongs to Churches Together in Ashford and Stanwell. Woodthorpe therefore has membership of both of these, covering around 30 churches.

and why NOW ?

What an awkward time to start a new church! Surely we need to get together for some kind of marriage ceremony, a wedding feast to which we invite all churches in the area to witness the launch of Woodthorpe Methodist Church __ an inspiring declaration of who we are and what we are setting out to do __ but we cannot do that.

Instead, this church has been brought to birth at a time of lockdown, with no guarantee of release in sight. So what is the elusive Holy Spirit up to? Why are we being called at such a time as this?

We have been blessed with a great opportunity for a time of preparation, a time of prayer, a time to explore, a time to ask questions. What can we offer those people who live and work in our neighbourhood? What does God want us to do, and what does He want us not to do?

Some eighteen months after we started our moving process the end is in sight! There's a lot of history and we look forward to the many museums opening again soon. If we need retail therapy we take the ferry across to Portsmouth's Gunwharf Quays. Ferries every minute and less than a pound! So we have well and truly landed on our feet.

We have tried to keep abreast of what's happening in the Circuit and, more importantly, with our friends. We shall miss you. We have followed the Staines Zoomed Sunday Services so haven't forgotten what you look like! We've joined Gosport Methodists and now plumb into a Zoom service from Fareham although there are few people that we yet know.

We would be pleased to have any visitors once lockdown eases; come for the day or longer.

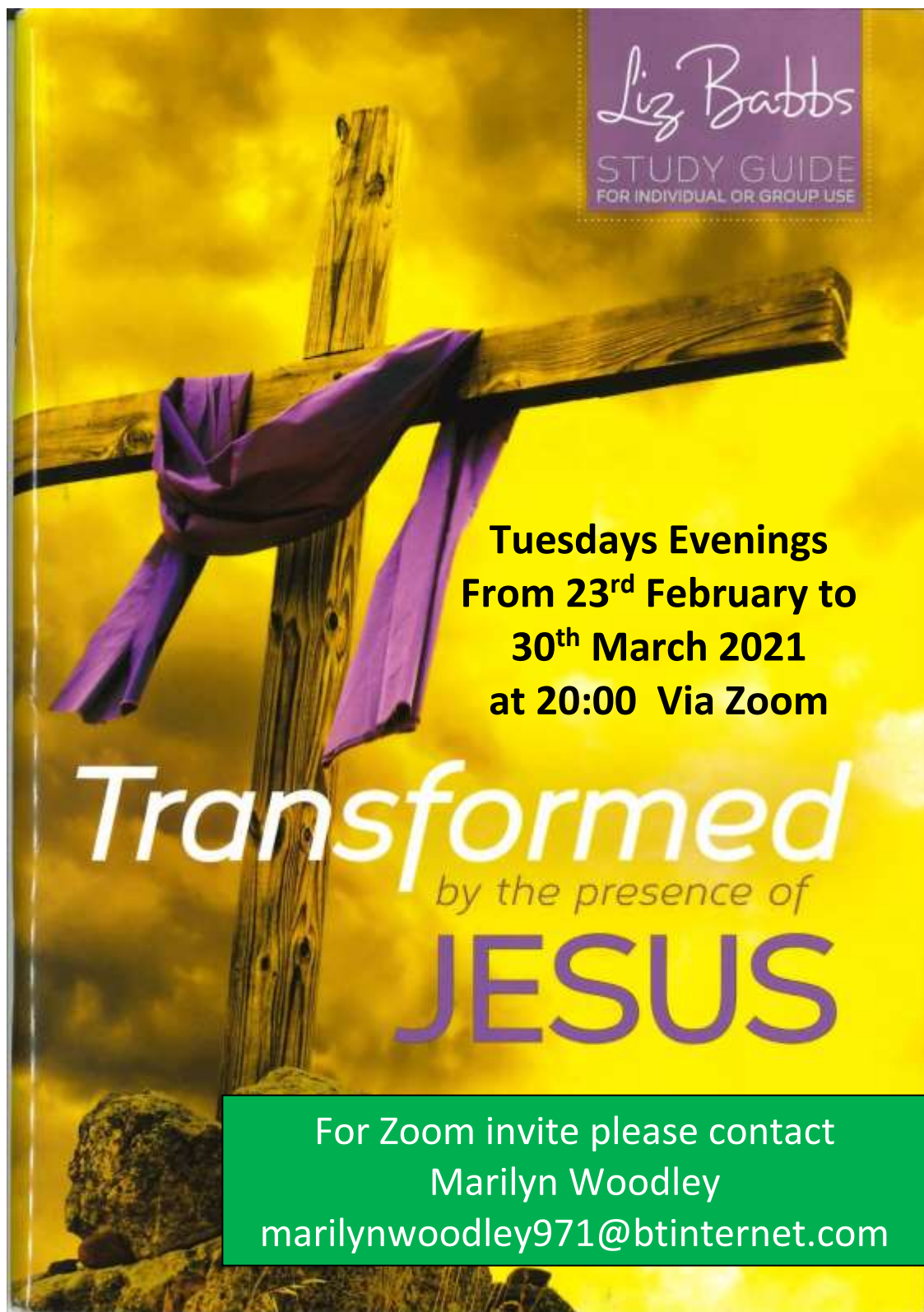

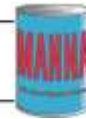

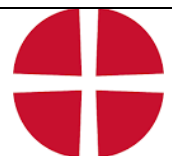
