I welcome this opportunity to update you on things that are happening in the Staines and Feltham Circuit. September and October are always busy for people in the Methodist Church and this year has been no exception, although for us, there has been the added task for of preparing for the visit of a prospective Minister to replace me from September 2025. I am really grateful for all the work that has been done by the Circuit Leadership Team and the Circuit Invitation Committee who have met on a number of occasions and have put together the documents that are needed as part of the process of stationing a new person in the Circuit. You are also probably aware that the Circuit has requested that a Deacon be allocated to the Circuit. We await the result of this request which we will receive in the new year. You may have been in Church in November when I was able to share the news that the Rev. Canon Judith Allford will continue to work at St. Jude's for one more year on a part time basis up until the summer of 2026. This is good news and it will provide support for the fellowship at the Church and the Village Centre during a time of significant change.

Various projects are under way at a number of the Churches around the Circuit and again, I am indebted to folk from the Churches who have drawn together the information that is needed to enable other groups and organisations to consider the proposals. We have a Property Sub-Group who are looking at these matters in some detail for us. Once this has been done the findings will then be presented to the Trustees at a Circuit Meeting. The Trustees will be able to determine which of these matters, if any, should be approved. Those which do receive permission will then move to the next stage of the process. Sometimes it can seem that too much time is spent on the administration of the Circuit and I am only too well aware of this, but the fact is that without this work being done, we will not be in the best place to share the Good News of the Gospel with our community.

As well as these tasks Sue, the Circuit Administrator, keeps on top of safeguarding training and DBS checks and over the past month she has contacted Circuit Trustees to make sure that the paperwork relating to eligibility to hold the role of a Trustee is in place. I thank all who have returned their forms. Once these are all back we will be able to update the Charity Commission website to reflect the current situation. This is also the time of prepare the annual returns year when we regarding and other details. In the past we have membership endeavoured to support local congregations by entering the data on to the website and this offer stands for this year as well. If your Church needs advice and support do contact Sue at the Office.

All that I have written here relates to how the Staines and Feltham Circuit seeks to introduce the people who live around our Churches to our Lord and Saviour. Without this work our Churches would not be able to provide a welcoming environment to those who come through our doors. At the time of Christmas and the New Year we have really good opportunities to invite family members and friends to join with us in celebrating the birth of the Lord Jesus. This is why we have a whole page in the current Plan devoted to Services covering the period from the 15th December up to Christmas Day. With one exception these Services take place within the walls of our Churches, but if you happen to be in Egham on the 21st December you can join the annual Street Nativity in the Please do have a look at the list of Christmas High Street. Services and work out which you would like to attend and who

might like to join you. I am sure that you will receive a warm welcome wherever you go. All of these Services are the visible expression of the love of God coming from the hearts and minds of those who put the Services together, along with all the individuals who provide readings, music and activities to help us celebrate the love of God expressed by a tiny baby lying in a manger in a stable in Bethlehem. My thanks to everyone who is going to contribute to our celebration of Christmas this year. I wish you a blessed and happy Christmas and a peaceful New Year.

Our New AV System

A project to bring our audio and visual equipment up to date was completed successfully in early October and already it's been commented on how much more clearly preachers can be heard.



A 75" screen at the front is fixed on an arm that means it can easiliy be moved into or out of view and



a 65" screen on the back wall gives a good view to the preacher of what's being shown.

Having both screens in use proved very useful during our October Intergenerational service. Where some seats have a restricted view of the front, material could be seen on the screen at the back. Images can also be relayed to an additional screen in the space at the back of the Church.

The equipment was well used during an Own Arangements Service for Remebrance Sunday when images from Whitehall could be shared.

In addition, the Boys' Brigade made use of the installation during a Bible Class looking at the development of popular Chirstian music.

We offer thanks to our Borough and County Councillor Harry Boparai who facilitated a grant through the Your Fund Surrey programme which met the bulk of the cost of the work. Grateful thanks are also extended to the Circuit who also made a material contribution that helped us finalise the work needed.




We celebrated 1 year together


