FROM OUR MINISTER



Dear Friends,

We are in the 12th week of Lockdown, where the guidelines are now aiming to relax the rules. No one can underestimate the havoc caused by COVID 19. People are experiencing heart-pain suffering, grief, stress, anxiety, many have lost their livelihood jobs and families have been torn apart and life for some will never be the same.

The Pandemic and its terrible emotions and suffering has been escalated by the death of George Floyd who died at the knee of a policeman in USA. We have witnessed riots, protests, destruction and hurt sparked by his death. These spread to most parts of the world under the banner “BLACK LIVES MATTER.” Last week we witnessed Patrick Hutchinson articulating a new definition, carrying a “ far-right protestor” whose life was in danger to safety, as he declared, *“it’s not black versus white- it is everyone versus racism”*. He focused the people’s minds to think. Life is precious, we are all created in the image of a holy God. The image of Patrick carrying an unnamed man was a graphic testimony which spoke poignantly to every individual with a conscience. The Church has to deal with these complex situations of both the effects of the coronavirus and social injustices affecting our world, these are shared concerns the world over.

COVID 19 has caused a crisis which will be remembered as a war fought by Doctors not soldiers, a war that was fought with soap not guns, a war that was fought by keeping a distance without contact. A war at home not in the battlefield. One significant thing that happened COVID19 shut down our church building but could not shut God Almighty. It is encouraging to note that the Church of God has continued even under these difficult circumstances to strive to keep “The Great Commission”. Despite the challenges it encountered to keep the promises of the Gospel of Christ. For the Church it is business as usual, the Church is not a building- the Church is people whether gathered or in dispersion in our communities. The Church has become creative in using technology and all the resources that are available through social media to engage, share and continue with its mission to

fulfil its calling. A variety of ways to worship are in place for our churches in this circuit. We are using Zoom for all our meetings, such as Church Council, Bible study, Circuit Leadership, Circuit, Local Preachers meetings and all other business meetings. We have several services at our disposal to reflect upon. Spiritually we are being nurtured more than ever before. Though we miss some of the Means of Grace and worshipping physically to gather in our buildings.

On the Eastern End things are fairly quiet. People self-isolating in their homes, those who still need to. Communication continues with those who cannot access Zoom services, printed services are delivered weekly. A large part of pastoral care is taking place, looking after one another, so that no one is left out isolated without some kind of contact. This season of coronavirus has been a learning curve to find other ways of keeping our faith.

Whatever it looks like when we return to worship physically together, whenever, that may be, we can be sure that God's Spirit has been at work. We will be entering a new era, in the Name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, the Triune God. May we trust God as he leads us forward, providing us with Living Water, the foundation to be Living Stones and all in power of the Living Spirit.

It is encouraging to know that the Church of God even under difficult circumstances has continued. I leave you to reflect on Hymn 804 Hymns and Psalms which speaks poignantly about our current situation:

The church of Christ in every age,
beset by change but Spirit-led,
must claim and test its heritage
and keep on rising from the dead.
Across the world, across the street,
the victims of injustice cry
for shelter and for bread to eat,
and never live until they die.
The let the servant church arise,
a caring church that longs to be

a partner in Christ's sacrifice,
and clothed in Christ's humanity.
For he alone, whose blood was shed,
can cure the fever in our blood,
and teach us how to share our bread
and feed the starving multitude.
We have no mission but to serve
in full obedience to our Lord:
to care for all, without reserve,
and spread his liberating word.

Whatever, you may have encountered during this season- your losses,
may you be encouraged to know that our hope is found in Christ alone.

Re-Opening Church

You will be aware that on the 23rd June 2020 the Government updated advice on the re-opening of Churches from the 4th July 2020. The impact of this decision needs to be carefully considered and presents the Methodist Church generally with a number of issues that need to be resolved before we can open Churches in the Staines and Feltham Circuit either for Services, our own use or for use by other Groups.

The Circuit Meeting held on the 23rd June 2020 discussed the matter and the view was that Churches will not re-open immediately. (Two Churches are currently open to host Pre-School Groups). The Staff and Circuit Leadership Team recognise that for some people the decision to defer re-opening will not be the outcome they desire or expect, but Managing Trustees have a duty to ensure that the premises for which they have responsibility are safe places for people to visit.

To help the Managing Trustees make an informed decision in relation to their premises the Circuit Leadership Team will consider in detail

documents issued both by the Government and the Methodist Connexion as they are received. It is likely that significant advice will become available during or immediately after the Methodist Conference which started on the 25th June 2020 and will end on Wednesday 1st July 2020.

Among the matters for local Churches to consider are:

- Use by other Groups of our premises
- Use by other denominations of our premises
- Holy Communion
- Use of Personal Protective Equipment
- Lifts to and from Church
- Cleaning
- Insurance
- Access to premises

In the meantime, the Circuit Meeting has noted that “Zoom” Services will continue to at least the end of the Connexional Year (August 2020), with a view to potentially opening Churches from Sunday 6th September 2020. **The Methodist Church is preparing a Service that can be used on that occasion, and it may well form the basis for our first Circuit Service.**

Please pray for our Managing Trustees, Staff and Circuit Leadership Team as they consider these important issues.

FROM OUR SUPERINTENDENT MINISTERS OFFICE AND BEYOND
Dear Friends

I wonder how the events of the past few weeks have affected you. On top of all that is happening in relation to the Coronavirus we have been confronted by other highly significant national and

international events. All of this information needs to be processed and people have responded in a variety of ways. My guess is that you find that you agree with some groups more than others as the arguments about the value of life, the place of statues in our community and history whirl around in our minds. I watch and listen to the news with an incredible sense of frustration sometimes and seek to find the place for my faith in the story as it unfolds.

For some reason it was the statues that kept coming into my thoughts. I saw Edward Colston plunging into the harbour and Sir Winston Churchill surrounded by a box and my mind went from Parliament Square to the West Front of Westminster Abbey. When the Abbey was built there were a number of niches for statues. When the building was restored in 1992 six statues were placed high up on the towers. In 1995 four allegorical figures were placed either side of the Great West door. These were. Truth, Justice, Mercy and Peace (Psalm 85:10). Many innocent people have lived and died to support these ideals. This left just ten niches over the door. A decision had to be taken about the people to be placed in each niche. Four Sculptors worked on creating the statues and they were unveiled on 9th July 1998. Each statue represents a Christian Martyr from the twentieth century.

Esther John from Pakistan was a Presbyterian Evangelist who allegedly killed by a Muslim fanatic in 1960.

Martin Luther King, a Baptist Civil Rights Campaigner was assassinated in 1969.

In 1973 Wang Zhiming, a Chinese Pastor and Evangelist was killed in the Cultural Revolution.

Janani Luwum was an Anglican Archbishop in Uganda who was assassinated during the rule of Idi Amin.

As recently as 1980 Oscar Romero from El Salvador who was the Roman Catholic Archbishop was assassinated.

I have repeated this article in the Staines Newsletter where you will find the names and brief details of the other five Martyrs.

We need our statues and we need to look at the stories they tell.

I must admit that whenever I visit Westminster Abbey I look at the statues on each side of the door and then I look at the ten people whose lives and deaths give meaning to what it is to be human as they stood for what they knew to be right.


