FROM OUR MINISTER



Dear Friends,

It was Brexit and we felt it was over, life was getting to *normal*. Little did we realise there was an invisible virus called COVID 19 just around the corner which was going to cause havoc and disruption of our lives in our homes, in our cities, in our country and beyond our borders.

On the 26th March 2020 a *LOCKDOWN* was put in place. We were asked to close our church building for worship; schools were closed; places of social life were closed; workplaces were closed; shops were shut down. The instructions were *STAY AT HOME! PROTECT THE NHS! SAVE LIVES!* This has never happened before in human history; the whole world has been shut. The Leaders of nations, scientists and WHO are all working hard to find a solution to destroy this invisible enemy of humanity. People are dying, people are hurting, people are in pain. People are asking questions; how did we get here? Where is our God? Is this the end of the world? At this very difficult time we need hope, a hope that keeps us calm to believe light will shine. It is well, the Lord is among us.

The Pandemic is a spiritual warfare and we need at these crucial times to pray without ceasing trusting God's influence through the Holy spirit to work with the leaders of the nations, to find effective treatment and make wise decisions that are meant to protect and save lives. Our belief in God, our Journey with the Risen Christ, our encounter with the Holy Spirit are not separate to life but are an integral part of who we are. We are the children of God. God knows our hopes, our desires, our heartaches of the present hibernation, isolation home centred existence.

As Christians we stand on the promises of God found in His Word to find hope and encouragement. 2 Chronicles 7:14

informs us: *“If my people who are called by my name , will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn away from their wicked ways, then will I hear from heaven and will forgive their sins and will heal their land.* God does hear our prayers, he will bring health and healing to our nations. All we need is to trust and put our hope in him, COVID19 will be eradicated.

On a very sad note Southville Methodist Church lost one of its prominent members. Mr Alan Cuthbert died on the 7th April 2020. He was a faithful committed servant of the Most High God. He had a special anointed voice; he moved the church by his singing and reading he made our worship service special. He played a major role in the Open the Book plays in schools – impacting the lives of those little children. His passing away has created a gap no one can fill. He is sadly missed by the Community at Southville. May his soul rest in Eternal peace and rise in glory. Our prayers and thoughts continue to be with his family.

On the Eastern End God is working with His Churches the Spirit is moving. Our God is a God who works in mysterious ways full of surprises. Before the Lockdown on the 15th of March 2020 in a combined Council meeting-of Ashford and Laleham Methodist churches agreed to be “One Church worshipping in two places”. The process of this great merger has started, to take the Resolution to Circuit. All I can say is glory to the Risen Christ. The Lent Courses we hold at Laleham continued until Good Friday with Zoom. And we are continuing with Bible study every Thursday at 10:00am using Zoom, there are nine of us participating. We found this very nurturing and it broke the monotony caused by our churches being closed, we fellowship and share with each other the word of God and our experiences.

The Community at Ashford Common Methodist Church is quiet, self-isolating in their homes. Our communication is by email and phone. The Sunday reflections sent by email are printed and dispersed to those who do not do emailing.

The community at Southville as I have ready stated above is grieving the passing away of Alan. Apart from that it is quiet, we communicate with emails and mobile phones.

In my own family we are very joyful at the birth of Anayi, Nandi Ushewokunze born to my son Tendayi and Gugu his wife in South Africa, on the 20th of March,2020. We thank God for technology because we communicate and see the baby. Rudado had bought a ticket before this lockdown to go and support the family at birth. BA cancelled it and she can book another date in the near future to travel.

Back to COVID19 I lost a sister-in-law Constance she was a nurse here in London and Rudo on the 4th of April a close friend. Constance is going to be cremated on the 20th of April 2020. This is very difficult for the families. We Zimbabweans take our bodies back home for burial, that is not happening. They are both to be cremated here, of course for good reasons.

Prayer: God of compassion, you heal the broken in spirit and give hope to the distressed. Teach us to wait with patience during this lockdown period, to trust that you are with us in the unknown future. And may the joy of your resurrection and the presence of the Risen Lord be with us all.

FROM OUR SUPERINTENDENT MINISTERS OFFICE AND BEYOND

Dear all,

The title of my letter is always the same, but this time the reality is that I am not getting much beyond the front door as is the case for all of us at the moment. This does not mean that things are not happening around the Circuit or amongst our fellowships. I am glad to have the opportunity to mention various things that have taken place over the past two months. We are fortunate that we were able to hold our Circuit Meeting back in February which means that the report we compiled has been passed on Shelagh Morgan, our District Synod Secretary. I have been told by Rev. David Hinchliffe that this report will be held on file until a future Synod can be held when it will join the others which will have been completed by that time. You may be aware that the Methodist Conference 2020 has been cancelled which means that the report, "God in love Unites Us" will now be considered, along with Synod responses in 2021. Our District Synod has also been cancelled. On the other hand many local meetings will continue to take place making use of technology. This of course raises the issue about what happens for those people who do not have access to such technology. In point of fact this is the main reason why many Churches have decided to defer General Church Meetings and Church Council Meetings where decisions have to be taken. The Circuit Leadership Team are looking at this and we will keep you informed. Interestingly, the advice from the Charity Commission is that we should aim to do the best we can and of course we try to do exactly this.

On a positive note, the Circuit has purchased a "Zoom" account which allows us to host meetings and Church Services which last longer than forty minutes. Some Churches have already

experimented with this and although it is a steep learning curve for those running the event, from the perspective of the viewer it is a positive and immersive experience where you can get to meet people; some of whom have not been able to get to church for a while in any event. I would like to encourage you to take the plunge and see if it might work for you.

I want to express my thanks to the Circuit Leadership Team, and Church Stewards for all that they are doing at the moment to keep up going. I am so pleased that people are supporting each other in so many varied ways.

In the hope that we will be able to meet together soon, Sue and I have been working on the next Plan which covers the period 1st June 2020 – 31st August 2020. I appreciate that some of these Services will not take place, but the moment we are given permission to meet in our Churches we will be ready.

I am always available on the end of the phone or via email if you would like to talk to me about any of the matters I have raised in my letter.

I end by asking us all to remember the families who are struggling at the moment with the situation we all face; especially those who have lost loved ones and those who are unwell at the moment. I assure you of my prayers at this time for everyone and also my prayers for our Government and all who seek to provide much needed support both here and around the world.

May we know the blessing and love of God at this time.

I am writing to ask for your support for Methodist Homes (MHA) staff, residents and their families, during what is an unparalleled time of challenge in our care homes.

Amidst the Covid-19 pandemic, our committed workforce at MHA has been working tirelessly to support our 6,000 residents. However, they have been doing so without a steady and secure supply of the correct personal protective equipment (PPE) and without testing for the virus, which would protect both them and our residents.

Our managers, nurses, carers, cleaners, maintenance staff, chef's, administrators and volunteers have daily been going into our homes, 50% of which are experiencing Covid-19 outbreaks.

That's why we need your help. We have been petitioning Government since the outset of the pandemic to address these shortfalls and to recognise the vulnerability of those in care homes alongside those in the NHS. Only now is it starting to be recognised that we are the second front line and we need to be properly equipped with all the tools to safely do that job.

Additionally, we need PPE so families are able to say farewell to their loved ones as they approach the end of their lives, as they are not currently allowed in our homes for the protection of residents, staff and themselves. We are therefore asking the Government to provide our homes with adequate and reliable PPE not just for our residents and colleagues, but also to offer to families.

We are now hearing that the Government are going to make more provision for PPE and testing in care homes, but these plans are light on detail and timescales. So we will continue to need to source PPE from commercial organisations, costing sometimes five times the price of Government supplies,

because those supplies have proved inconsistent and inadequate. And we will continue to need to transport PPE across the country between our homes, to meet need when homes experience a Covid-19 outbreak. And we will continue to cast a light on how vulnerable those in our homes are, residents and staff, to this pandemic. We have already lost over 200 residents where they have been confirmed or suspected as having Covid-19; and we have lost two of our colleagues.

Our church has a proud tradition of social justice and concern, out of which MHA itself was born 76 years ago. So I am asking you and your churches to stand alongside us at this vital time to ensure that those most vulnerable and those working on the front-line to care for them, have access to the correct and necessary PPE and testing.

- You can support us by signing our petition to ask the Government to ensure adequate and consistent supplies of PPE and timely and ample testing for residents and staff by 26 April.


