


FROM OUR MINISTER

Dear Friends,

I can start this letter, by stating that I am settling good in the Staines and Feltham Circuit.

We are experiencing the Good News in all the facets of our life together as a Community of Believers in this place. Towards the end of November, we were in Advent, when we looked forward to the Birth of Christ the light of the World. In that season of waiting and preparing to honour him in our hearts and serve Him, we had four Advent sessions based on YORK COURSES "So what are you waiting for ". The sessions were held at Laleham Methodist Church. The response was good a number of people attended from our Circuit and other Churches.

The evaluation of the session at the end was very encouraging. These are some of the comments:

- *"I had some wonderful conversations and benefited from having some space to reflect on God.*
- *Brought people together from different Churches to learn and share together what God wants to teach us this Advent.*
- *I enjoyed the fellowship, enjoyed being able to express what I thought and ask spiritual questions- good to discuss different topics from usual.*
- *It made me think about time and my attitude to it*
- *Interesting inspiring discussion with friendly people.*

The comments on the usefulness of content were as follows:

- *The booklet was most helpful*
- *I think the CD was not useful as the book text*
- *Too much material, difficult to concentrate on CD problem with York Courses*
- *I found York Course to be a bit stilted in the past and content a bit dry*
- *Venue warm and comfortable*
- *Plenty of space to break into groups-welcoming and good hospitality*
- *7:30pm for 8pm start seemed about right.*



The Advent sessions were well received, and it seem we can do more other things together in the future, creating space for informal learning and spiritual growth events.

In less than a week we go into the New Year 2018. We close 2017. We are beginning a "New Journey" which needs both our individual and corporate commitment to our Calling as Church in this place. A New Year is a gift from God, a new opportunity, a New Year is a Journey, it needs direction and vision with specific goals.

Our five Churches are standing in very difficult places. We are faced with situations, challenges and difficulties and these may differ radically in the New Year. The Lord encourages us by His Word in Lamentations 3: 22-23 that his mercies never end, in which case, they may be specific, different and unique. OnTheOutProject December 2017 Update

No way of escape

Being vulnerable to cruel people, unable to cope, vulnerable to alcohol and drug abuse

Having mental health issues

Seeing yourself as unlovable

Separated from your own family

Nowhere to live, no job

Feeling of rejection

Feeling lost

Feeling empty

Feeling helpless

Life has no meaning

Life has no purpose

Life has no hope

Unable to, or choosing not to, make use of organised means of equipping prisoners for the outside world

So you are released from prison : *(on the out)*

Without a coat (and this is winter !)

Not knowing where the railway station is *(the most common destination for most people in this category, though often via the off-licence)*

Alone, or with people who are likely to lead you into more trouble, for example, drug and alcohol abuse leading to violent offences leading to more time in prison.....

Who will save you from this vicious circle ?

This is where OnTOP comes in. Since October 2016, OnTOP, overseen by Kingdom Living Church, Staines (Laleham Methodist Church premises) has supported people leaving prison (in particular HMP Bronzefield, the largest female prison in Europe, off Woodthorpe Road, Ashford). Two aspects of the ministry are : -

1) Fortnightly church service followed by a drop-in session.

2) Pastoral 1 to 1 support which sometimes involves the provision of food and clothing.

A third aspect of the ministry has recently been added : -

3) "Through the Gate" (TTG) support. This involves meeting women on the day of their release and offering to accompany them on foot to Ashford train station. This is a specialist service focussing on women who have not engaged with the various agencies that offer structured TTG support. This aspect of the project is in association with the Bronzefield Chaplaincy Department, and is being pioneered by Simeon Sturney, from Kingdom Living Church, who is driven by the desperate needs of those people whom most of us would choose to ignore / avoid / hide from, but whom Jesus has shown an amazing willingness to walk alongside and suffer with in order to bring them into His kingdom of light and peace.

Here, surely, is a window of opportunity for the Church to get involved : -

Prayer : people not too busy to spend time each day in a quiet place, interceding and seeking God's way forward.

Practical support in the various activities : worship, drop-in, pastoral, TTG etc.

Donations of clothing, food, money etc.

We at Southville continue with our weekly collection of food for the Riverside Vineyard Storehouse.

The following items are in popular demand:

Long-life milk

Pasta Sauces

Rice

Biscuits/sweet snacks

Small bags of sugar

Small bottles of oil

Tinned Soups

NO PASTA PLEASE

Tinned fish – tuna, salmon

Tinned meat – meatballs, corned beef, curry etc.

Breakfast cereals – small/medium sized boxes

Tinned vegetables/fruit/beans/tomatoes

Tea/Coffee/juice/squash (no alcohol please)

Puddings – Rice/Custard

Toiletries

Things to consider: The size of the items: standard sizes are most helpful.

This is because many of the Storehouse guests travel on public transport or foot so larger/heavier items are impractical.
