

FROM OUR MINISTER



Dear Friends,

I am now standing in for Andrew. He has gone for his Sabbatical leave, and he will be back at the beginning of September.

We thank the Methodist Church generosity and graciousness, for the gift of Sabbatical leave, to its ministers. This provides the minister with space and time to stand still, to see life wholeness and to be refreshed and invigorated for continued ministry. The Lord Jesus himself taught his disciples to rest (Mark 6:31). I hope Andrew will benefit from his time on Sabbatical, let's continue to lift him and his family before the Lord in our daily prayers.

As such I am here to assist with normal running of the life of the Staines and Feltham Circuit. There is great support, if you need help contact me or Mrs Pauline Shilston or the Circuit office.

However, a lot of things happened last year as a result, this Summer has been a time of mixed feeling and emotions of joy and at the same time pain. There was so much to be joyful about. Joy of the Royal Wedding at Windsor on the 19th of May. The whole mood of society was animated with joy. The global community responded with so much joy. There was great jubilation as far as Swaziland and of course the world over. We thank God for times to be joyful together as humanity.

From another angle, there has been pain grief as the nation focused their minds on the first commemoration of the Manchester Arena bombing on the 22nd of May where twenty-two people lost their lives. A Service of remembrance was held at the Manchester Cathedral. It was difficult to watch the

television of the mother of the first victim narrating the harrowing experience of what happened on that fateful day.

Today is the 14th of June a year since the fire at Grenfell tower, in which seventy-two people lost their lives. Those who died were remembered in Services that took place in parts of London including silent marches.

It is important to commemorate and remember these tragedies and events. People lost their loved ones, their homes. There is deep pain and sorrow. Those who grieve cannot be expected to have easy or swift healing- it takes time. Grief can be so overwhelming that we find it impossible to move on dreading each new day. Remembering is supposedly therapeutic, reminding us of our own mortality. We also learn from these experiences so that any mistakes made are not repeated.

During the occurrence and aftermath of these tragedies the most significant thing that stood out was that Communities came together to help, support, encourage, cry and lament together. There was a great sense of togetherness, a sense of belonging to one another, unity and love was evident locally and globally. Life is grounded in Community, the whole of humankind in its existence and all its relationships. Hence the Lord Jesus Christ commanded and taught” *Love one another, love your neighbour*” (Mark 12: 30-31).

Sadly, those lessons come at a cost, often through tragedy and pain, a tremendous suffering for such awakening. We need each other. No man is an Island. As I reflect on that, I am reminded of the chorus of a hymn in Singing the Faith Hymn book.

As God loves us, so let us love each other: with no demands, just open hands and space to grow.

May God help us to love one another and to make it a way of life on daily basis.

I wish you all a good summer as you travel near and far to visit friends and relatives.


