



# FROM OUR SUPERINTENDENT MINISTERS OFFICE AND BEYOND

Dear all,

Since I last put pen to paper for the Eastern End News a lot has been happening. Over the long, hot summer I had my Sabbatical during which I did some work on my railway layout and a model boat. In addition I enjoyed spending time looking at the Minor Prophets. I have shared some of this with Churches around the Circuit and will continue to do so in the coming months. I am grateful that Juliet, Sue and folk around the Circuit ensured that we were supported over the period of the Sabbatical.

Since September we have been looking once more at the plans for our Circuit. We are due to meet with people from the Richmond and Hounslow Circuit in mid January 2019 to explore the opportunities and issues that need to be addressed in order for us to be able to complete the re-alignment of the Circuit as soon as we can. The intention is to do this if at all possible, by September 2019. I will keep you informed of progress as things unfold.

It is possible that by the time you read this the sale of Virginia Water Methodist Church may have been completed. It has proved somewhat more complicated than we have originally anticipated.

The Circuit leadership Team and staff from the South East District have been working with Ashford and Laleham Churches. We hope to meet in the near future to move this on to the next stage. Currently both Churches are sharing their buildings for Sunday Services. Details of this can be found in the current Plan.

The Partnership at Christ Church, Feltham held a Carol Service on the 13<sup>th</sup> December which was very exciting and was well attended. I am especially grateful to Roger and Jonathan who

have helped us with lots of the tricky bits in getting the Church ready for this Service. Regular Services commence on Sunday 13<sup>th</sup> January 2019. An Advisory Oversight Group has been established to manage the Partnership in these early days. We pray that God will bless the new congregation as it begins to become a spiritual presence in the town of Feltham. You may be aware that three denominations have been using the premises for a number of years and we have been working with them to determine if we can offer alternative accommodation in the area. I would like to take this opportunity to wish them well for the future and pray that God will richly bless their endeavours. I also express my thanks to Rev Anne Dollery at St Dunstan's and for the work that is carried on in the name of the Ecumenical Parish of Feltham.

It was a real joy to attend Southville Methodist Church in early December to meet with some of the children from the local Primary School. We had a great time and I really enjoyed hearing them sing. We look to build on our relationship with the school during the year.

Over the past few months I have enjoyed popping in to see members of Boys' Brigade at Ashford Common. It is a real privilege to share aspects of God's word with them and to join in the activities. My thanks to all those who support this very important work.

Even in this period of upheaval and change people are simply getting on with the task of serving God as I hope you sense from this letter and I am grateful for your help and support.

## Feltham Christmas Tree Festival

This was held on the first weekend in December and despite a late start, due to not knowing what was happening at Christ Church, we had eleven trees entered plus 4 of our own trees from Southville. Trees were decorated to depict a Christmas Carol or Song.

On the Friday morning the children from the three Reception Classes at Cardinal Road School visited the festival. Each class visit culminated in a special telling of the Christmas story by Rev. Anne complete with yards and yards tinsel. Our highlight was when each class treated us to a song from their Christmas Show.

On Friday afternoon it was the turn of the three classes from Year 1. Their highlight was the Christmas story told by Rev. Andy Watkin. This time no tinsel but a variety of animals in the stable including a kangaroo and lots of hallelujahs from the choir of angels. Some 180 children plus teachers and parents heard the Christmas story in the very special setting of the Christmas Tree Festival.

On Saturday approximately 89 people attended the festival and were invited to vote for their favourite tree. The winner was a tree made from decorated, recycled plastic bottles entered by Cardinal Road School. During Saturday a variety of craft activities were available for both young and old.



On Tuesday 11<sup>th</sup> December Year 2 of Southville Infants school visited the Church to learn about Christian Celebrations and to hear the Christmas Story. We are very thankful to Rev Andrew Reed for coming along to talk to the children. The children then entertained us with songs from their Christmas Concert.

### THE BUILDING

November and December have seen lots of improvements being undertaken at Southville thanks to the generosity of past members. We now have new flooring throughout the entire building and new folding chairs and storage trolleys. The new kneelers are on order and there are plans being made to replace the altar curtains and fit a blackout blind to the window behind the Clavinova.



The generosity of our current members continued in December as instead of exchanging individual Christmas Cards, we all wrote Christmas greetings to one another in a “Shareable Christmas Card” and donated £96.00 to the work of World Vision. The Church also sent a donation to Crisis of £112.72 to provide four places at one of their Christmas shelters.



Open The Book now regularly reaches over 600,000 children in over 2,400 schools and we are delighted to be a part of this, taking bible stories into school assemblies. Our group has members from both Southville and St Dunstons (the Ecumenical Parish).

We are pleased to say that we are now working with four local schools.

The team has recently been telling the Story of David and Goliath in our local schools. Our Goliath was so scary that several children had to be reassured he was only acting! We received letters and texts from three schools thanking the group.

Please continue to pray for the children, their parents and the teaching staff in all the local schools in our community.
