



## FROM OUR MINISTER



Dear Friends,

First and foremost I would like to acknowledge and thank most sincerely the people in our Circuit who contributed generously clothes, linen, shoes, toys for the people of Zimbabwe after Iddah Cyclone hit Malawi , Zimbabwe and Mozambique on the 17<sup>th</sup> of March, 2019 and over a thousand people lost their lives and some were never accounted for. I managed to pack 12 big boxes. These are waiting for collection by the Zimbabwe Embassy. Thank you all for opening your hearts and allowed yourselves to stand with the people of Zimbabwe in their most difficult time. I appreciate, God bless you as you bless others.



In March our media was so much taken up by Brexit, as we moved towards the deadline of 29<sup>th</sup> March, 2019. It seemed like the only news item each day, which showed that we can sometimes become inward looking. Because God who controls all things was involved in the Brexit process, it was postponed to 31<sup>st</sup> October 2019 probably for a *Kairos* moment. God's own timing. The same applies to our re-alignment process with another circuit. The deadline was September 2019, the goal post has been moved to September 2020. The Lord is moving with His Church in this place towards his plan and we might end up with something totally different from what we envisaged from the start of the process but good. Isaiah 55:8 reminds us *for as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts.*

This is so true to our re-alignment process at this point and time. God is at the centre of all that is happening and all that we trying to do. The final word rests with him. Let us continue to wait and trust on him in prayer.

Just a brief account of what is happening on the Eastern side of the Circuit lately.

### **Laleham and Ashford:**

Both Churches made their responses to the South East District Report proposals

Ashford Methodist Church did not embrace the District report proposals. Ashford Methodist Church felt they need a local church, which will serve their community. They have come up with their vision which moves them into the future.

Meanwhile Laleham Methodist Church would like to explore the District Report proposals and come up with a plan of action that will secure the continuing development of Laleham.

However, Laleham Methodist Church is now trying to find alternative partnerships with Churches in their vicinity.

The joint services arrangement will continue between Laleham and Ashford Churches. These are not easy decisions; we need a lot of prayers for the Lord to guide his Church and all those who are involved.

### **Christ Church Feltham:**

The documentation and logistics of the Partnership are being looked at in finer detail, meetings are taking place to achieve this. We thank God for this great vision, to open the doors of Christ Church- Worship and Fellowship is continuing and it seems people in Feltham are responding and coming to join the Church.

## **Ashford Common Methodist Church:**

The work of God continues with Sunday worship, coffee mornings and the Boys Brigade playing a significant role in the life of the Community.

## **Southville Methodist Church:**

The Church has been very busy during the Holy Week working with EPC. There were services of prayers and meditations shared with St Dunstan.

The Lent period has been very exciting, with a number of Bible studies and prayer meetings in most of our churches. At Laleham we had lent studies on prayer using the book "Say it to God in search of prayer".

The sessions were well attendant with individuals from churches together. It was a welcoming relaxed group. Hospitality, timing, and venue found helpful with enough parking.

Here are a few of their comments at the end of the sessions:

- a. Very helpful- helped to bring me closer to God- to pray more, use my time wisely (spiritually) We should do the same next year.*
- b. Good to meet people from other fellowships of the church locally and the use of a book as the basis of the study along with references of Scripture.*
- c. Its been a very rewarding course and so good to share with other Churches- I shall be finishing the book on my own time. Hospitality excellent, the rock cakes were excellent... thank you Mary. It would be great if we can do something similar next year.*
- d. I like the interactive nature and encouragement of all to speak and enjoyed listening to the comments of others. I think the book " Say it to God" is very good material- good*

*reading and thought provoking and edifying- I believe this will help my prayer life immensely.*

Today is Easter Sunday, as I write. It is a great day that changed the whole world.

Let us relive the experiences of those who met the risen Lord face to face and let us walk and talk with him in turn, sharing their joy and wonder. Together let us rejoice in the resurrection life that shapes our lives.

## FROM OUR SUPERINTENDENT MINISTERS OFFICE AND BEYOND

Easter 2019 is now behind us and we will perhaps remember it for very different reasons than we might have expected. I think that none of us would have considered that people attending Easter Services would be killed in such a horrific way as happened in Sri Lanka, nor might we have expected the riots that took place in Northern Ireland, or, on a different scale entirely, the destruction of Notre Dame in Paris. Three major events that I am sure will shape memory of Easter 2019. Our prayers reach out to everyone who has been affected by these events. I must admit that these events made me look at the Easter story in a new way and perhaps to understand just how immense the work of Jesus on the cross is and actually, how immense it needs to be.

I hope that your experience of Lent and Easter has equipped you for the days that lie ahead, both on a personal level, but also as Church communities. In my previous letter I mentioned that here, on this side of the Circuit we are in conversation with

the Hounslow and Richmond Circuit. A report is due to be handed to Adam Nywao, their Superintendent, on the 30<sup>th</sup> April. This report deals with three specific issues raised by that Circuit for us to address. The first matter is to explore in more detail the partnership relationship at ChristChurch. As a result of this I invited Adam to meet with us and with representatives from the Anglican Church. This was a fruitful conversation which indicated that there is real scope for close working over the coming months and years.

The second matter is more complicated in that the Leadership Team in Richmond and Hounslow would like to understand the relationship between Ashford and Laleham Churches. The Staines and Feltham Circuit sought advice from the District. A report was prepared and considered by both Churches. It raised a number of issues and both Churches have provided responses which are helpful and will lead to further discussion. Alongside this, Juliet and I have consulted Charles Palmer who is working on behalf of the Methodist Connexion. He travels around the country and meets with local Churches to discuss different options for the use of buildings which are no longer required for Services. These ideas need to be explored locally and by the time you read this both Ashford and Laleham will have had the opportunity to think about outline suggestions that can be explored in more detail over the coming days.

Those churches that I have not mentioned (Southville and Ashford Common) might also benefit from a conversation and this will be offered in due course.

I hope that you do not feel as though you have been left out in the cold in regard to this complex process. No one has

contacted me in response to my previous letter, but do please get in touch if you have any ideas or if you feel that you need more information than I have been able to provide in this general update.

Once again, do please pray for the Circuit Leadership Team, the Circuits and the local Churches as we seek guidance from God regarding the way we should go.



We had an incredible response in April for Easter Offering when £113.50 were the proceeds.


You can sign up to lead a coffee morning on the sheet on the hymn book table, it would be brilliant to have your help.

### THE ECUMENICAL PARISH OF FELTHAM

#### **HOT CROSS BUNS**

528 Hot Cross Buns, known as 'Church Buns' in some schools, were distributed to 11 schools in the Ecumenical Parish of Feltham with a card containing the following message:
