



From the Circuit Office – and Beyond

Dear Friends

Last month the following article was featured in the Staines Newsletter. It contains information about the Methodist Conference which I hope you will find to be of interest.

I would like to share with you some of the matters that were discussed at the Methodist Annual Conference which took place between the 24th June and the 1st July at Birmingham. Full details of topics discussed and all associated papers can be found on the Methodist Website. In this letter I am highlighting just a few of the topics that were discussed. I begin with the fact each year the President and Vice President are appointed at the Conference. This year Rev. Sonia Hicks is the President and Barbara Easton is the Vice President.

Dealing with **Education, Children and Young People**, Conference received a report from 3Generate, the Methodist Children and Youth Assembly which urges the Church to prioritise a response

to the climate crisis, caring for others and their mental well health, being inclusive, kind and welcoming to all, ending poverty and sharing the love of Jesus with others. Conference also received a report on strategy for the Methodist Church over the next ten years which seeks to extend the influence of the church in children's education and the communities they serve as an expression of the Gospel.

Turning to **Ethical, Moral and Political Issues** Conference asked the President and Vice President to write to the President of COP 26 asking them to make bold decisions. Conference also sent a message of support to the Young Christian Climate Network's relay to COP 26. A group of young people taking part in the relay called in at Staines Methodist Church on Monday 2nd August for some light refreshments on their journey to Glasgow.

The Joint Advisory Committee on Ethics of Investment recommended that the Church remove investment from all oil and gas companies which are not aligned to the Paris Agreement target of a global temperature rise well below two degrees. Conference also instructed that a letter should be sent to the Prime Minister and the Foreign Secretary about the cut in the Foreign Aid budget from 0.7 to 0.5%. Other topics that were discussed under this heading were: Equality, Diversity and Inclusion, the Farming industry, Immigration, Israel and Palestine, use of single use plastics, the slave trade and the equitable use of vaccine resources.

Under the heading of **Ecumenism, Mission and Evangelism** Conference agreed that licences for use of Methodist premises by other denominations need not in future be limited to one year. This will have an impact on those denominations that use our premises under a licence. Do please speak to me if you would like more information about this.

The impact of Covid-19 on Methodist Central Hall Westminster was discussed.

A new Connexional Mission Committee will commence from September 2022 which will support mission both locally and globally. It will also oversee the process of the allocation of grants and funding for mission and missional activities. Conference also looked at a number of items when they considered the work of **Ministry, Presbyters and Deacons**. In particular it sought to clarify the role of Stewards by amending Standing Order 634. Conference received a report on “Changing Patterns of Ministry” which would authorise the establishment of the office of Local Lay Pastor. Various Committees now have the task of taking the necessary steps to establish the role within the church. The report also looked at itinerancy and has identified three key aspects of what it means to be an itinerant Minister in the Methodist Church. a) Methodist Ministers are Connexional people available for deployment by the conference where required and this will be time limited. b) Ministers are stationed each year and only a limited number of Ministers are available for deployment. Individual needs will be considered, but the covenant relationship implies a readiness to be open to the needs of the Connexion. c) Ministers and Deacons who are released for study or to serve in a different context are not released from Stationing nor from the covenant relationship of being in Connexion. Conference also received a report from the Diaconal Order. A Memorial from the Southampton District was accepted by Conference which sought to affirm the role of Supernumerary Ministers. The Ministries Committee will oversee implementation of the proposals. I leap over several pages to reach the section on **Worship and Faith**. Before I share with you the Conference decisions about relationships I should mention that Holy Communion as part of on line worship is to be allowed

from the 1st September 2021 for a trial period. The rules surrounding this are quite complex and I will spend some time looking at them before discussing the matter initially with the Stewards.

It is highly likely that you are aware of the decision taken at conference to confirm the 2019 resolution whereby Conference consents in principle to the marriage of same-sex couples on Methodist Premises throughout the Connexion ... in so far as the law of the relevant jurisdiction permits or requires and subject to compliance with such further requirements, if any, as that law imposes. In addition to this Conference adopted guidance on the understanding of marriage set out in the report and instructed that it be included in the Guidance Section of the Constitutional Practice and Discipline of the Methodist Church. I quote a section from the Guidance as amended.

“Legally, marriage is a contractual relationship entered into by two people who make solemn vows and commitments to each other, without either the nature of the marriage or the nature of the commitments being further defined under the law of the land. In the understanding of the Methodist Church, marriage encompasses that but is also deeper and richer. The Methodist church **understands** that marriage is a covenant relationship between two people, within God’s covenant of love with them. Through it they may experience, explore and express God’s gracious love. The Methodist Church **understands** that marriage is an exclusive relationship, freely entered into with a lifelong intention of uniting two people in body, heart, mind and soul in ways that are appropriate to each partner. In it, God’s Spirit enables both partners to know the security of love and care, bringing to each other comfort and companionship, enrichment and encouragement, tenderness and trust. Through such

marriage children may be nurtured, family life strengthened and human society enriched.”.

Conference instructed the Methodist Council to oversee production of (i) resources to inform Methodist people about the decisions concerning the provisional resolutions of the 2019 Conference and (ii) legal and pastoral guidance for Managing Trustees and Presbyters about how to proceed in making any decisions in the life of the local Church. Conference commended its decisions to the Methodist people asking them earnestly to pray for healing where there has been hurt, for unity where there has been division and for wisdom where difficult discussions lie ahead.

I am not yet aware of the processes that need to be followed for further consideration of this change to our Discipline other than to let you know that same-sex wedding services will not be taking place on Methodist Church premises before 1st September 2021 at the earliest.

Decisions taken at Conference this year are going to have a significant impact on the Methodist Church, both locally and globally. Do please remember our Churches and the Circuit in your prayers over the coming days.

'Being an Assistant District Chair'

When I was asked to consider taking on the above role in our Western bit of the District, I asked what the job entailed. The answer I was given was - 'You find out as you go along!' On the one hand that might be seen as less than helpful but at least it gives lots of latitude and space for each person to shape the role themselves!

Fundamentally, the role that I (and my two other ADC colleagues – Deborah Cornish in the Southern area, which includes Gibraltar and Malta – Helen Hollands in the Eastern area) fulfil is to support the District Chair, David Hinchliffe. Sometimes that means supporting David as we work alongside him in meetings such as the District Synod, District Council and District Leadership Team; other times we might stand in for him if he can't manage all the meetings that come his way (which is quite a lot!) or, as it has been during this last church year, when he had his 3 month sabbatical.

Since I started in September 2020 I've been involved in the following:


- Preaching around the Circuits (although, so far due to Covid-19, I've not managed to actually get to many church buildings!);
- Pastoral support for Circuits, Superintendents (through weekly Zoom meetings) and other staff colleagues;
- Provision of a weekly District Worship Resources for people not able to attend church;
- Advice re stationing, Circuit staffing, church activities and management, Circuit Leadership Team support and general encouragement, or being a 'sounding board' for new ideas or problem solving;


- Chairing meetings in Circuits, when needed, or just ‘being present’, if that helps a discussion;
- Chairing the ‘Western Area Development Group’ – as we work through ideas together and see where we can support each other across the Circuits;
- Looking at the future development of the District Interfaith and Refugee Advisor work;
- Supervision – regular, intentional, bi-monthly sessions with five ministerial colleagues to assist and develop their ministry and support their life and general well-being;
- Rep to ‘Churches Together in Surrey’.

It’s been quite a challenge but a very interesting time – especially with two Synods, in two months, both on Zoom, while David was away!

Essentially I see the role as one of support – for any and all that may value my input or accompaniment. It’s been a delight to share in some of the work in your Circuit already and I look forward to sharing more of that journey with you as the months and years unfold.


The Boys' Brigade 7th North Surrey Company




