



FROM OUR MINISTER

Dear Friends,

I begin this letter on a sad note, in February one of our longstanding faithful and committed member of Ashford Methodist Church, Mrs Jean Garlick was called to the Church Triumphant. She made great contributions to the life of the Methodist Church and was known by many in the Ashford. Her husband Revd Kenneth Garlick was a Methodist Minister and served from 1984-1992 in the Staines and Feltham Circuit. Her service of thanksgiving was conducted by Reverend Peter Clark. May her soul rest in peace and rise in glory. Our prayers continue to be with the family.



As I write we are in Spring. Outside the sun is shining, it is beautiful the birds are singing. Spring is special, it brings new life. The flowers begin to bloom, the birds and animals give birth to new life. There is a freshness after the dullness of winter.

So, it is with Christian life, during the Lenten season, we looked at the events in the life of our Lord Jesus Christ. Our Lenten meetings were held at Laleham Methodist Church and Southville Methodist Church. The response was very good several people did attend and seem to have been nurtured.

Lent took us to the resurrection day, Easter day, a day all about new life. Christ conquered death, he rose again, and we have new life in him. In Christ we are a new creation.

Our Christian Calendar is so full of new life and variety, which makes our Spiritual pilgrimage interesting. Easter celebration is completed at Pentecost which is in four weeks' time. The feast of Pentecost is the most important celebration after Christmas and Easter. Pentecost marks the day we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit. Lord Jesus' resurrection and glorification sent the Holy Spirit over His Church to bear witness as the Prophets had promised.

I will pour out my spirit on all flesh, your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, your old men shall see visions (Joel 2 :28).

The feast of Pentecost marks the birth of the Church. Pentecost means new life for the Church, new life for the individual within the Church and new life for the whole creation.

Psalm 104 pushes the horizon of Pentecost into a large sphere of faith and reality. The gift of the Holy Spirit concerns not only the Church but all life and the well being of the whole of creation.

...when you take their breath away they die and return to dust. When you send your Holy Spirit they are created, and you renew the face of the Earth. (Psalm 104: 29b-30)

The world depends on God 's breath to function, without God's Holy Spirit we all die. Even the Church cannot have its own terms without reference to God's life-giving Spirit. The Earth is depended on God as a young child with its mother. The Spirit of God is active in the human affairs.

When Pentecost Sunday comes I urge you *Receive the Holy Spirit* (St John 20: 22). If we can, the Pentecost experience will come to us and we will never be the same. We will go into the world as spirit activated disciples equipped to be Christ's hands and feet in our time and place.

Before I put my pen down just to give a brief update of what is happening in the churches I am in pastoral charge of.

Christ Church

Worship ceased on the 28th of January 2018. Most of the members have joined Churches in the Ecumenical Parish of Feltham, that is Southville Methodist Church and St Dunstan Anglican Church, which is good news because they are among friends. We continue to hold them in prayer in their spiritual journey.

There has been a proposal for a church plant at Christ Church by the Anglican Church.

There is continuing background work going on as of now, between the Staines and Feltham Circuit and the Church of England to come up with a Partnership plan. This proposal will consider the work of the Ecumenical Parish of Feltham.

Laleham and Ashford Methodist Churches

The future of these churches continues to be under discussions. Both Churches have joint services and some attend Thursday Fellowship at Laleham weekly. The relationship and fellowship shared are edifying.

Ashford Common Methodist Church

This Church's direction is influenced by what happens in the other Churches.

However, in the above churches, we continue to experience God through our worship, praise, teaching, prayer and fellowship. It is true we find ourselves standing in hard places where decisions must be made. Christ is with us all the time, though the path is hidden. He knows what is best and I believe he will do all things well.

FROM THE CIRCUIT OFFICE AND BEYOND

Dear Friends,

Andrew Reed is soon heading off on a Sabbatical. The Methodist Church describes a Sabbatical as, "...a time away from the usual day-to-day job, for further study, reflection, recreation and some renewal...The Church believes sabbaticals are important and therefore they are compulsory for all presbyters and deacons" and are required to be taken in the tenth year of travel and every subsequent seventh year. Andrew's sabbatical starts on Monday 4th June 2018 and will finish three months later on Sunday 2nd September.

Andrew has identified an area for study and reflection: the Minor Prophets and seeking to explore what they have to say to us today. This will involve a fair amount of background reading, but the main focus will be on preparing material for multi-media presentation - a topic that has fascinated Andrew for a long time and will help him to support those who follow the new course for Local Preachers and Worship Leaders that encourages the use of technology in Services. Andrew will develop his ideas how best to use the work on the Minor

Prophets for the benefit of individual churches or the Circuit as a whole.

Alongside his studies, Andrew will work on his model railway and continue to build a model boat. He and his wife, Pat, will also be able to spend more time with family, friends and each other.

A Sabbatical Support Group has been put in place to ensure that the work of the Circuit continues over the summer. Rev. Juliet Ushewokunze will be Acting Superintendent and Mrs. Pauline Shilston is the Convenor of the Support Group. Matters will inevitably arise during the Sabbatical and should be addressed to either Juliet or Pauline. Sue Burgoine will continue to work at Staines and can be contacted there as usual.

So far as the Plan is concerned, Andrew, Juliet and Sue have compiled a Plan to cover the period from June to November and Juliet and Sue will continue to look after this during the sabbatical. Please remember Andrew, Pat and their family in your prayers during the sabbatical that they will be refreshed and reinvigorated for the beginning of the next Connectional Year.

What a week this has been!

While seldom having a week with nothing to do this last one has been quite remarkable.

It was on the Monday that I attended a Celebration Service for a friend from Staines Hockey Club who I had known for over 50 years. The Old Windsor Parish Church was completely filled with his family and colleagues from the many activities he had been involved with.



Tuesday was the Celebration for the life of Margaret Willis at St Judes, Englefield Green. Once again it was a full church with support from the Circuit and beyond. The story of her life, traumatic at times was a remarkable record of how she had overcome the difficulties even near the end when she had planned the service and had even requested a visit to Lego Land. Items were presented by members of the family and her long term close friend Judith Alford. A wonderful person who will be greatly missed by many.

A short break on Wednesday followed by a chaotic Thursday. Not quite in the same category but challenging starting with a phone call at 07:45 from a Gas Service engineer.

Some trees we planted 2 foot tall were taller than the house and an apple tree was well past its useful presence. To see someone climbing the tree armed with a chain saw and the large chipping machine working was amazing. However the garden should benefit from the increased light – we shall see!



Saturday and another Celebration Service this time in Bristol. Many will remember Rev Clabon Allan who served for some years in the circuit and was my close neighbour. Having relocated on retirement to Australia we learned late last year that his wife Margaret had sadly passed away. The Funeral was held in Australia but



Clabon felt that there were many friends they had known in the United Kingdom and arranged for a service to be held in Bristol where they had been for a period earlier.

As well as many of Clabon's family there making contributions, others with links with work carried out by Clabon and Margaret with the Church of Christ in China in Hong Kong following a periods in Malaysia, made contribution.

When they returned to the UK in 1987 Margaret worked in the China Department of Churches together in Britian and Ireland. She was often involved in greeting Chinese students, many from Amity in China where She had worked in Hong Kong.
