





FROM OUR MINISTER



Dear brothers and sisters,

I visited Zimbabwe end of January and came back beginning of February this year. Life is not easy, people are burdened, there is galloping inflation, prizes are increasing every day. The poor are poor and the rich are rich. Healthy services are not accessible to all people, for drugs and other medical supplies are most impossible to obtain unless you have foreign currency and one has to pay to get treatment. The *motto is no payment no treatment*.

The transport system is very expensive because petrol is now a very scarce commodity. You have to queue for two to three hours to get it. However, the sad story of Zimbabwe is that one cannot find maize mealie sold anywhere in the shops, there is a great shortage people spend time hunting for it. This is our staple food which sustains the entire nation. Maize meal is like



potatoes and bread to Western countries. Those on the margin of society are most vulnerable for they depend on it for their survival. In addition to that climate change has affected the

rain season and most parts of the country suffered drought. Most fields are not planted. My prayer is that our Lord Jesus Christ will replenish our land with its once abundant blessings- that men and women will strive for good and cherish what the



Lord bestowed upon us in this great land, that the fields would be full of crops again. Lord it is you who make men see light. It is you who hold the real lessons of life. Lord bless the nation of Zimbabwe.

Time is not standing still we are already in March of 2020.

As for the Churches on the Eastern End the work of the Kingdom continues, worship, learning, caring, service and evangelism. There is nothing significant to point out all seems to be going well.

At Ashford Common Methodist Church Mr Frank David Hughes, a long-standing member, faithful disciples of Christ who served in many different roles in his church and Circuit passed away peacefully at his home. He is sadly missed. May his soul rest in eternal peace and rise in glory. His funeral and Thanksgiving Service were on the 19th February 2020 at Ashford Common Methodist Church. His burial was at Sudbury Cemetery. Our prayers and thoughts continue to be with his wife Mrs June Hughes and the family.

The Re- alignment process work is going on behind scenes as to the future of our Churches. The Christ Church Partnership documentation remains work in progress. These processes, I have completely relinquished them into the hands of God. I have given them as completely as the farmer gives his wheat to the soil, trusting God that he will bring everything together at his appointed time to fulfilment.

We are now entering Lent, a time we give our whole heart to God. Joel reminds us *'Even now, says the Lord, return to me with your whole heart, with fasting and weeping, and mourning;*

Render your hearts, not your garments, and return to the Lord your God' (Joel 2:12-13a). Lent is a season of conversion. A turning, a returning to the God revealed in Lord Jesus, a God who is gracious, merciful and rich in kindness.

Three Lenten activities which engage our whole hearts to turn to God are prayer, fast and giving alms. In prayer we lift our minds and hearts to God who is slow to anger and relenting in punishment. Fasting helps us to do the will of God. By alms giving we reach out to those in need through financial assistance and service. It is not sufficient just to do these things, we need to do them wholeheartedly. These are things an individual can undertake.

At Laleham Methodist Church we are having Lent sessions based on the Revelations of Julian of Norwich "LOVE is the MEANING". All are welcome.

I am trusting God that in the busy routine of life, with its many pressures and responsibilities during this Lent period we will find moments to reflect on what Lord Jesus meant to those who walked with him, his disciples, the Pharisees, the women and what he continues to mean to us today.

May the Lord bless you during this Lenten period leading to Easter.

He grew up alongside my children and took a very active part in the Church Youth Club and the then very thriving M.A.Y.C. In his early twenties he would always be there in the background doing the donkey work. In my minds eye I can see him still now, late one Friday night, in the church kitchen helping to prepare and serve food to an M.A.Y.C. group from further afield who had come up to London for the annual M.A.Y.C. celebrations and were making our church (including overnight sleeping) their base for the weekend. He was always the organiser for these sorts of occasions.

In latter years he (and Shirley) have faithfully produced the church magazine each month, often printing them late into the night to make sure that they were ready on time. Those of us who knew him well were also quite confident that we could pick up the phone to ask for his help if we needed it, particularly where computers were concerned! He was, for Shirley, quite simply – her rock!

He was a kind, caring, gentle, selfless and humble man and such a faithful servant of Christ. I give thanks for having known him.

To this end I am arranging

to meet with each Church, along with members of the Circuit Leadership Team and with Rev. Juliet to consider the implications for each site. We will then arrange for all churches to get together so that we can obtain the wider perspective. We will do this with the assistance of a Facilitator and will use a course entitled, "Our Church's Future Story". Further information about this will be provided shortly.






